HOUSE BILL NO. 4862

August 29, 2019, Introduced by Reps. Wozniak, Markkanen, Coleman and Yaroch and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 20981 (MCL 333.20981), as added by 2016 PA 40.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 20981. (1) As used in this part:
- 2 (a) "Acute or cumulative psychological stress or trauma" means
- 3 an unusually strong emotional, cognitive, behavioral, or physical
- 4 reaction that may interfere with normal functioning, including, but





- 1 not limited to, 1 or more of the following:
- 2 (i) Physical and emotional illness.
- 3 (ii) Failure of usual coping mechanisms.
- 4 (iii) Loss of interest in the job or normal life activities.
- 5 (iv) Personality changes.
- 6 (v) Loss of ability to function.
- 7 (vi) Psychological disruption of personal life, including a 8 relationship with a spouse, child, or friend.
- 9 (b) (a) "Critical incident" means an actual or perceived event
 10 or situation that involves crisis, disaster, trauma, or emergency.
- (c) (b) "Critical incident stress" means the acute or

 cumulative psychological stress or trauma that an emergency service

 provider may experience in providing emergency services in response

 to a critical incident. The stress or trauma is an unusually strong

 emotional, cognitive, behavioral, or physical reaction that may

 interfere with normal functioning, including, but not limited to, 1

 or more of the following:

- 19 (ii) Failure of usual coping mechanisms.
- 20 (iii) Loss of interest in the job or normal life activities.
- 21 (iv) Personality changes.
- (v) Loss of ability to function.

- 8 (ii) Critical incident stress defusings.

- 10 (iv) On-scene support services.
- 11 (v) One-on-one support services.
- (vi) Consultation.
- 13 (vii) Referral services.
- (e) (d) "Critical incident stress management team" or "CISM
- 15 team" means an organized community or local crisis response team
- 16 that is a member of the Michigan Crisis Response Association
- 17 Network.
- (f) (e) "Critical incident stress management team member" or
- 19 "CISM team member" means an individual who is specially trained to
- 20 provide critical incident stress management services as a member of
- 21 a critical incident stress management team.
- 22 (g) (f) "Emergency service provider" means an any of the
- 23 following:
- 24 (i) An individual who provides emergency response services,
- 25 including a law enforcement officer, corrections officer,
- 26 firefighter, emergency medical services provider, dispatcher,
- 27 emergency response communication employee, or rescue service
- 28 provider.



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- 1 (ii) An individual who is employed by or under contract with a 2 health facility or agency.
- 3 (iii) A physician.
- 4 (2) In addition, article 1 contains general definitions and 5 principles of construction applicable to all articles in this code 6 and part 201 contains definitions applicable to this part.
- 7 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days 8 after the date it is enacted into law.
