## **HOUSE BILL NO. 5248**

November 13, 2019, Introduced by Reps. Hall, Schroeder, LaFave, Steven Johnson, Webber, LaGrand, Camilleri, Crawford and Liberati and referred to the Committee on Families, Children, and Seniors.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 204, entitled "The children's ombudsman act,"

by amending section 9 (MCL 722.929), as amended by 2013 PA 38.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 9. (1) Subject to subsections (2) through (7) and except
- 2 as provided in subsection (8), a record of the children's
- 3 ombudsman's office is confidential, shall only be used for purposes
- 4 set forth in this act, is not subject to court subpoena, and is not
- 5 discoverable in a legal proceeding. A record of the children's





- 1 ombudsman's office is exempt from disclosure under the freedom of
- 2 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246. If the
- 3 ombudsman identifies action or inaction by the state, through its
- 4 agencies or services, that failed to protect children, the
- 5 ombudsman shall provide his or her findings and recommendations to
- 6 the agency affected by those findings, and make those findings and
- 7 recommendations available to the complainant, and the legislature
- 8 upon request, and the public upon request, to the extent consistent
- 9 with state or federal law. The ombudsman shall must not disclose
- 10 any information that impairs the rights of the child or the child's
- 11 parents or guardians.
- 12 (2) The ombudsman may release information to a complainant or
- 13 to a closed session of a legislative committee that has
- 14 jurisdiction over family and children's services issues regarding
- 15 the department's handling of a case under the child protection law
- 16 that is obtained or generated during an investigation conducted by
- 17 the office.
- 18 (3) Unless otherwise part of the public record, the office
- 19 shall must not release any of the following confidential
- 20 information to the general public:
- (a) Records relating to mental health evaluation or treatment
- 22 of a parent or child.
- 23 (b) Records relating to the evaluation or treatment of a
- 24 substance abuse-related use disorder of a parent or child.
- 25 (c) Records relating to medical diagnosis or treatment of a
- 26 parent or child.
- 27 (d) Records relating to domestic violence-related services and
- 28 sexual assault services provided to a parent or child.
- 29 (e) Records relating to educational services provided to a

- 1 parent or child.
- 2 (4) Notwithstanding subsection (3), if the ombudsman
- 3 determines that disclosure of confidential information is necessary
- 4 to identify, prevent, or respond to the child abuse or child
- 5 neglect of a child, the ombudsman may disclose information in his
- 6 or her possession to the department, a court, a law enforcement
- 7 agency, or a prosecuting attorney investigating a report of known
- 8 or suspected child abuse or child neglect. The ombudsman shall not
- 9 release the address, telephone number, or other information
- 10 regarding the whereabouts of a victim or suspected victim of
- 11 domestic violence unless ordered to by a court.
- 12 (5) Except as provided in subsection (4), the ombudsman shall
- 13 not disclose information relating to an ongoing law enforcement
- 14 investigation or an ongoing children's protective services
- 15 investigation. The ombudsman may release the results of its
- 16 investigation to a complainant, or an individual not meeting the
- 17 definition of complainant, if the ombudsman receives notification
- 18 that releasing the results of its investigation is not related to
- 19 and will not interfere with an ongoing law enforcement
- 20 investigation or ongoing child protective services investigation.
- 21 (6) The ombudsman shall not disclose the identity of an
- 22 individual making a child abuse or child neglect complaint under
- 23 the child protection law unless that individual's written
- 24 permission is obtained first or a court has ordered the ombudsman
- 25 to release that information.
- 26 (7) The ombudsman may release an individual's identity who
- 27 makes an intentionally false report of child abuse or child neglect
- 28 under the child protection law.
  - (8) At the end of an investigation conducted by the office

- 1 under this act, the ombudsman may release his or her findings and
- 2 recommendations to the public. The ombudsman shall redact
- 3 confidential information, including, but not limited to,
- 4 information described in subsection (3) and any other material as
- 5 the ombudsman considers appropriate.
