## **HOUSE BILL NO. 5287**

December 10, 2019, Introduced by Reps. Wittenberg, Brenda Carter, Haadsma, Pagan, Pohutsky, Rabhi, Ellison, Hoadley, LaGrand, Peterson and Hammoud and referred to the Committee on Local Government and Municipal Finance.

A bill to amend 1972 PA 348, entitled

"An act to regulate relationships between landlords and tenants relative to rental agreements for rental units; to regulate the payment, repayment, use and investment of security deposits; to provide for commencement and termination inventories of rental units; to provide for termination arrangements relative to rental units; to provide for legal remedies; and to provide penalties,"

(MCL 554.601 to 554.616) by amending the title and by adding section 1c.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 TITLE





- 1 An act to regulate relationships between landlords and tenants
- 2 relative to rental agreements for rental units; to quarantee full
- 3 and equal access to, and full and equal use and enjoyment of,
- 4 residential rental accommodations regardless of a tenant's or
- 5 prospective tenant's source of income; to regulate the payment,
- 6 repayment, use, and investment of security deposits; to provide for
- 7 commencement and termination inventories of rental units; to
- 8 provide for termination arrangements relative to rental units; to
- 9 provide for legal remedies; and to provide penalties.
- 10 Sec. 1c. (1) A landlord shall not, based on the source of
- 11 income of a prospective or current tenant, do any of the following:
- 12 (a) Deny or terminate a tenancy to the prospective or current
- 13 tenant.
- 14 (b) Make any distinction, discrimination, or restriction
- 15 against the prospective or current tenant in the price, terms,
- 16 conditions, fees, or privileges relating to the rental, lease, or
- 17 occupancy of a rental unit or in the furnishing of any facilities
- 18 or services in connection with the rental, lease, or occupancy of a
- 19 rental unit.
- 20 (c) Attempt to discourage the rental or lease of any rental
- 21 unit to the prospective or current tenant.
- (d) Assist, induce, incite, or coerce another person to commit
- 23 an act or engage in a practice that violates this section.
- 24 (e) Coerce, intimidate, threaten, or interfere with any person
- 25 in the exercise or enjoyment of, or on account of the person having
- 26 exercised or enjoyed or having aided or encouraged any other person
- 27 in the exercise or enjoyment of, any right granted or protected
- 28 under this section.
  - (f) Represent to the prospective or current tenant that a



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- 1 rental unit is not available for inspection or rental when the
- 2 rental unit in fact is available for inspection or rental.
- 3 (g) Otherwise make unavailable or deny a rental unit to the
- 4 prospective or current tenant because of his or her source of
- 5 income.
- 6 (2) A landlord shall not publish, circulate, issue, or
- 7 display, or cause to be published, circulated, issued, or
- 8 displayed, any communication, notice, advertisement, or sign of any
- 9 kind relating to the rental or lease of any rental unit that
- 10 indicates a preference, limitation, or requirement based on any
- 11 source of income.
- 12 (3) If a landlord requires that a prospective or current
- 13 tenant have a certain threshold level of income, any source of
- 14 income in the form of a rent voucher or subsidy must be subtracted
- 15 from the total of the monthly rent before calculating if the income
- 16 criteria have been met.
- 17 (4) A person who suffers a loss as a result of a violation of
- 18 this section may bring an action to recover actual damages or up to
- 19 4.5 times the monthly rent of the rental unit or units at issue,
- 20 whichever is greater, together with court costs and reasonable
- 21 attorney fees.
- 22 (5) As used in this section, "source of income" includes
- 23 benefits or subsidy programs including housing assistance, public
- 24 assistance, emergency rental assistance, veterans benefits, Social
- 25 Security, supplemental security income or other retirement
- 26 programs, and other programs administered by any federal, state,
- 27 local, or nonprofit entity. The term does not include income
- 28 derived in an illegal manner.
