February 25, 2020, Introduced by Reps. Liberati, Frederick, Calley and Brenda Carter and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1972 PA 222, entitled

"An act to provide for an official personal identification card; to provide for its form, issuance and use; to regulate the use and disclosure of information obtained from the card; to prescribe the powers and duties of the secretary of state; to prescribe fees; to prescribe certain penalties for violations; and to provide an appropriation for certain purposes,"

by amending sections 1 and 2 (MCL 28.291 and 28.292), section 1 as amended by 2018 PA 605 and section 2 as amended by 2018 PA 669.





THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1. (1) A person An individual who is a resident of this 1 2 state may apply to the department secretary of state for an official state personal identification card. Upon application, the 3 4 applicant shall supply a photographic identity document, a birth 5 certificate or other nonphotographic identity document, and other sufficient documents as the secretary of state may require to 6 7 verify the identity and citizenship of the applicant. If an applicant for an official state personal identification card is not 8 9 a citizen of the United States, the applicant shall supply a 10 photographic identity document and other sufficient documents to verify the identity of the applicant and the applicant's legal 11 presence in the United States under subsection (5). The documents 12 13 required under this subsection must include the applicant's full 14 legal name, date of birth, address, and residency and demonstrate 15 that the applicant is a citizen of the United States or is legally present in the United States. If the applicant's full legal name 16 17 differs from the name of the applicant that appears on a document presented under this subsection, the applicant shall present 18 19 documents to verify his or her current full legal name. An 20 application for a an official state personal identification card 21 must be made in a manner prescribed by the secretary of state and 22 must contain the applicant's full legal name, date of birth, 23 residence address, height, sex, eye color, signature, intent to be 24 an organ donor, other information required or permitted on the official state personal identification card and, only to the extent 25 26 to comply with federal law, the applicant's Social Security number. The applicant may provide a mailing address if the applicant 27 28 receives mail at an address different from his or her residence

- 2 493a of the Michigan election law, 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.493a, an
- 3 applicant for an official state personal identification card must
- 4 indicate on the application or change of address application

- **8** (2) The secretary of state shall accept as 1 of the
- 9 identification documents required under subsection (1) an
- 10 identification card issued by the department of corrections to
- 11 prisoners who are placed on parole or released from a correctional
- 12 facility, containing the prisoner's legal name, photograph, and
- 13 other information identifying the prisoner as provided in section
- 14 37(4) of the corrections code of 1953, 1953 PA 232, MCL 791.237.
- 15 (3) The secretary of state shall have electronic access to
- 16 prisoner information maintained by the department of corrections
- 17 for the purpose of verifying the identity of a prisoner who applies
- 18 for an official state identification card under subsection (1).
- 19 (4) The secretary of state shall not issue an official state
- 20 personal identification card to a person an individual who holds an
- 21 operator's or chauffeur's license issued under the Michigan vehicle
- 22 code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, unless the license has
- 23 been suspended, revoked, or restricted.
- 24 (5) If the applicant is not a citizen of the United States,
- 25 the applicant shall provide, and the department shall verify,
- 26 documents demonstrating his or her legal presence in the United
- 27 States. Nothing in this act shall obligate or be construed to
- 28 obligate obligates this state to comply with title II of the real
- 29 ID act of 2005, Public Law 109-13. The secretary of state may adopt

- 2 MCL 24.201 to 24.328, as are necessary for the administration of
- 3 this subsection. A determination by the secretary of state that an

- 11 Security number obtained under subsection (1) to another person
- 12 except for use for 1 or more of the following purposes:
- 13 (a) Compliance with 49 USC 31301 to 31317 and regulations and
- 14 rules related to this act.
- 15 (b) To carry out the purposes of section 466(a) of the social
- 16 security act, 42 USC 666, in connection with matters relating to
- 17 paternity, child support, or overdue child support.
- 18 (c) With the department of health and human services, for
- 19 comparison with vital records maintained by the department of
- 20 health and human services under part 28 of the public health code,
- 21 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.2801 to 333.2899.
- 22 (d) As otherwise required by law.
- 23 (7) The secretary of state shall not display a person's an
- 24 individual's Social Security number on the person's individual's
- 25 official state personal identification card.
- 26 (8) A requirement under this section to include a Social
- 27 Security number on an application does not apply to an applicant
- 28 who demonstrates he or she is exempt under law from obtaining a
- 29 Social Security number.



- (9) The secretary of state, with the approval of the state administrative board created under 1921 PA 2, MCL 17.1 to 17.3, may enter into agreements with the United States government to verify whether an applicant for an official state personal identification card under this section who is not a citizen of the United States is authorized under federal law to be present in the United States.
- (10) The secretary of state shall not issue an official state personal identification card to a person an individual holding an official state personal identification card issued by another state without confirmation that the person individual is terminating or has terminated the official state personal identification card issued by the other state.
 - (11) The secretary of state shall do all of the following:
- (a) Ensure the physical security of locations where official state personal identification cards are produced and the security of document materials and papers from which official state personal identification cards are produced.
- (b) Subject all persons each person authorized to manufacture or produce official state personal identification cards and all persons each person who have has the ability to affect the identity information that appears on official state personal identification cards to appropriate security clearance requirements. The security requirements of this subdivision and subdivision (a) may require that official state personal identification cards be manufactured or produced in this state.
- (c) Provide fraudulent document recognition programs to department secretary of state employees engaged in the issuance of official state personal identification cards.
 - (12) If an individual meets the requirements under subsection



- 1 (13), the secretary of state shall allow the individual to elect a
- 2 communication impediment designation on the application maintained
- 3 in the central file under section 7 or in another appropriate
- 4 system that limits access to law enforcement that would allow law
- 5 enforcement agencies of this state to view a communication

- 7 identification card.
- 8 (13) An individual seeking an election for a communication
- 9 impediment designation under subsection (12) shall provide the

- 18 (14) The secretary of state shall not display an individual's
- 19 communication impediment designation on the individual's official
- 20 state personal identification card.
- 21 (15) A person who intentionally makes a false statement of
- 22 material fact or commits or attempts to commit a deception or fraud
- 23 on a statement described under subsection (13) is guilty of a
- 24 misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 30 days or
- 25 a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both.
- 26 (16) Subject to subsection (17), the secretary of state may
- 27 cancel or revoke a communication impediment designation elected and
- 28 maintained under this section if either of the following
- 29 circumstances applies:



- 1 (a) The secretary of state determines that a communication 2 impediment designation was fraudulently or erroneously elected.
- 3 (b) The secretary of state determines the communication4 impediment designation was abused during a traffic stop.
- 5 (17) The secretary of state shall provide an individual notice 6 and an opportunity to be heard before canceling or revoking a 7 communication impediment designation under subsection (16).
- 8 (18) As used in this section, "communication impediment" means
 9 an individual has a health condition that may impede communication
 10 with a police officer, including, but not limited to, the
 11 following:
 - (a) Deafness or hearing loss.
- 13 (b) An autism spectrum disorder.
- 14 Sec. 2. (1) An official state personal identification card 15 must contain the following:
- 16 (a) An identification number permanently assigned to the
 17 individual to whom the card is issued.
 - (b) The full legal name, date of birth, sex, residence address, height, weight, eye color, digital photographic image, signature of or verification and certification by the applicant, as determined by the secretary of state, and expiration date of the official state personal identification card. If an official state personal identification card is issued to an individual described in section 1(5) who has temporary lawful status, the official state personal identification card must be issued in compliance with 6 CFR 37.21 or in compliance with the process established to comply with 6 CFR 37.71 by the secretary of state. As used in this subdivision, "temporary lawful status" means that term as defined in 6 CFR 37.3.

- $\mathbf{4}$ (ii) Immunization data of the individual.
- 5 (iii) Medication data of the individual.
- 6 (iv) A statement that the individual is deaf.
- 7 (d) In the case of a holder of an official state personal
- 8 identification card who has indicated his or her wish to
- 9 participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101 of
- 10 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, a
- 11 heart insignia on the front of the official state personal
- 12 identification card.
- 13 (e) If requested by an individual who is a veteran as that
- 14 term is defined in section 1 of 1965 PA 190, MCL 35.61, a
- 15 designation that the individual is a veteran. The designation must
- 16 be in a style and format considered appropriate by the secretary of
- 17 state. The secretary of state shall require proof of discharge or
- 18 separation of service from the armed forces of this state, another
- 19 state, or the United States, and the nature of that discharge, for
- 20 the purposes of verifying an individual's status as a veteran under
- 21 this subdivision. The secretary of state shall consult with the
- 22 department of military and veterans affairs in determining the
- 23 proof that must be required to identify an individual's status as a

- 8 (i) Information explaining the applicant's right to make an
 9 anatomical gift in the event of death under part 101 of the public
 10 health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in
 11 accordance with this section.
 - (ii) Information describing the donor registry program maintained by Michigan's federally designated organ procurement organization or its successor organization under section 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120. The information required under this subparagraph includes the address and telephone number of Michigan's federally designated organ procurement organization or its successor organization as described in section 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120.
- (iii) Information giving the applicant the opportunity to have his or her name placed on the registry described in subparagraph (ii).
- (b) Provide the applicant with the opportunity to specify on his or her official state personal identification card that he or she is willing to make an anatomical gift in the event of death under part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in accordance with this section.
- (c) Inform the applicant that, if he or she indicates to thesecretary of state under this section a willingness to have his or



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- 1 her name placed on the donor registry described in subdivision
- 2 (a) (ii), the secretary of state will mark the applicant's record for
- **3** the donor registry.
- **4** (3) The secretary of state may fulfill the requirements of
- 5 subsection (2) by 1 or more of the following methods:
- **6** (a) Providing printed material enclosed with a mailed notice
- 7 for the issuance or renewal of an official state personal
- 8 identification card.
- **9** (b) Providing printed material to an applicant who personally
- 10 appears at a secretary of state branch office.
- 11 (c) Through electronic information transmittals for
- 12 applications processed by electronic means.
- 13 (4) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form of the
- 14 official state personal identification card. The secretary of state
- 15 shall designate a space on the official state personal
- 16 identification card where the applicant may place a sticker or
- 17 decal of a uniform size as the secretary may specify to indicate
- 18 that the cardholder carries a separate emergency medical
- 19 information card. The sticker or decal may be provided by any
- 20 person, hospital, school, medical group, or association interested
- 21 in assisting in implementing the emergency medical information
- 22 card, but must meet the specifications of the secretary of state.
- 23 The sticker or decal also may be used to indicate that the

- of state police a digitized photograph taken of the applicant for an official state personal identification card for use as provided in section 5c of 1927 PA 372, MCL 28.425c.
- 4 (e) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the department 5 of licensing and regulatory affairs the images of applicants for an 6 official state registry identification card issued under section 6 7 of the Michigan medical marihuana act, Medical Marihuana Act, 2008 8 IL 1, MCL 333.26426, if the department of licensing and regulatory 9 affairs promulgates rules requiring a photograph as a design 10 element for an official state registry identification card.
- 11 (f) As necessary to comply with a law of this state or the 12 United States.
 - (7) If an individual presents evidence of statutory blindness as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368, and is issued or is the holder of an official state personal identification card, the secretary of state shall mark the individual's official state personal identification card in a manner that clearly indicates that the cardholder is legally blind.
- 19 (8) The secretary of state shall maintain a record of an 20 individual who indicates a willingness to have his or her name placed on the donor registry described in subsection (2)(a)(ii). 21 22 Information about an individual's indication of a willingness to 23 have his or her name placed on the donor registry that is obtained by the secretary of state and forwarded under this section is 24 25 exempt from disclosure under section 13(1)(d) of the freedom of 26 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.243. As required in section 27 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120, the secretary of state shall establish and maintain the donor registry 28 in a manner that complies with that section and that provides 29



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- 1 electronic access, including, but not limited to, the transfer of
- 2 data to this state's federally designated organ procurement
- 3 organization or its successor organization, tissue banks, and eye
- 4 banks.
- 5 (9) An official state personal identification card may contain
- 6 an identifier for voter registration purposes.
- 7 (10) An official state personal identification card must
- 8 contain information appearing in electronic or machine readable
- 9 codes needed to conduct a transaction with the secretary of state.
- 10 The information must be limited to the information described in
- 11 subsection (1)(a) and (b) except for the person's individual's
- 12 digital photographic image and signature or verification and
- 13 certification, state of issuance, and other information necessary
- 14 for use with electronic devices, machine readers, or automatic
- 15 teller machines and must not contain the individual's driving
- 16 record or other personal identifier. The official state personal
- 17 identification card must identify the encoded information.
- 18 (11) An official state personal identification card must be
- 19 issued only upon authorization of the secretary of state, and must
- 20 be manufactured in a manner to prohibit as nearly as possible the
- 21 ability to reproduce, alter, counterfeit, forge, or duplicate the
- 22 official state personal identification card without ready
- 23 detection.
- 24 (12) Except as otherwise provided in this act, an applicant
- 25 shall pay a fee of \$10.00 to the secretary of state for each
- 26 original or renewal official state personal identification card
- 27 issued. The department of treasury shall deposit the fees received
- 28 and collected under this section in the state treasury to the
- 29 credit of the general fund. The legislature shall appropriate the



- 1 fees credited to the general fund under this act to the secretary
- 2 of state for the administration of this act. Appropriations from
- 3 the Michigan transportation fund created under section 10 of 1951
- 4 PA 51, MCL 247.660, must not be used to compensate the secretary of
- 5 state for costs incurred and services performed under this section.
- **6** (13) An original or renewal official state personal
- 7 identification card expires on the birthday of the individual to
- 8 whom it is issued in the fourth year following the date of issuance

- 11 The secretary of state shall not issue an official state personal
- 12 identification card under this act for a period greater than 4
- 13 years. Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of
- 14 state may issue a renewal official state personal identification
- 15 card for 1 additional 4-year period by mail or by other methods
- 16 prescribed by the secretary of state. The secretary of state shall
- 17 require renewal in person by an individual required under section
- 18 5a of the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.725a,
- 19 to maintain a valid operator's or chauffeur's license or official
- 20 state personal identification card.
- 21 (14) The secretary of state shall waive the fee under this
- 22 section if the applicant is any of the following:
- 23 (a) An individual 65 years of age or older.
- 24 (b) An individual who has had his or her operator's or
- 25 chauffeur's license suspended, revoked, or denied under the
- 26 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, because
- 27 of a mental or physical infirmity or disability.
- 28 (c) An individual who presents evidence of statutory blindness
- 29 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368.



- 1 (d) An individual who presents evidence of 1 or more of the2 following:
- (i) A notice of case action from the department of health and
 human services indicating that the individual is a participant in 1
 or both of the following programs and is making his or her
 application for an official state personal identification card
 during a period in which he or she is receiving benefits:
 - (A) The family independence program.
 - (B) The state disability assistance program.
- 10 (ii) A United States Social Security Administration benefit
 11 award letter indicating the applicant is currently receiving
 12 payments under the federal supplemental security income program as
 13 that term is defined in section 57 of the social welfare act, 1939
 14 PA 280, MCL 400.57, or the Social Security disability income
 15 program.
- 16 (iii) A United States Social Security Administration benefit
 17 verification letter indicating the applicant is currently receiving
 18 payments under the federal supplemental security income program as
 19 that term is defined in section 57 of the social welfare act, 1939
 20 PA 280, MCL 400.57, or the Social Security disability income
 21 program.
- (e) An individual who decides to add or remove a heartinsignia described in subsection (1)(d).
- (f) An individual who is a veteran as that term is defined in section 1 of 1965 PA 190, MCL 35.61. The secretary of state shall require an individual who seeks a waiver of the fee under this subdivision to provide the secretary of state the same documentation required for a veteran designation under subsection (1) (e) before granting the fee waiver.



- 1 (g) An individual who presents both of the following:
- 2 (i) A homeless verification letter that states that the
- 3 individual meets the definition of category 1 homeless as that term
- 4 is defined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban
- 5 Development. A letter provided as evidence under this subparagraph
- 6 must be submitted on the official letterhead of a public service
- 7 agency. The department secretary of state may verify the
- 8 information contained in the letter with the agency of issuance
- 9 before issuing an official state personal identification card.
- 10 (ii) A photo identification card generated from the United

- 14 (15) An individual who has been issued an official state
- 15 personal identification card shall apply for a renewal official
- 16 state personal identification card if the individual changes his or
- 17 her name.
- 18 (16) An individual who has been issued an official state
- 19 personal identification card shall apply for a corrected
- 20 identification card if he or she changes his or her residence
- 21 address. The secretary of state may correct the address on an
- 22 official state personal identification card by a method prescribed
- 23 by the secretary of state. A fee must not be charged for a change
- 24 of residence address.
- 25 (17) An individual who has been issued an official state
- 26 personal identification card may apply for a renewal official state
- 27 personal identification card for 1 or more of the following
- 28 reasons:

(a) The individual wants to change any information on the



- 1 official state personal identification card.
- 2 (b) An official state personal identification card issued
 3 under this act is lost, destroyed, or mutilated, or becomes
 4 illegible.
 - (18) An individual may indicate on an official state personal identification card in a place designated by the secretary of state his or her blood type, emergency contact information, immunization data, medication data, or a statement that the individual is deaf.
- 9 (19) No later than January 1, 2017, the The secretary of state 10 shall develop and shall, in conjunction with the department of 11 state police, implement a process using the L.E.I.N. or any other appropriate system that limits access to law enforcement that 12 allows law enforcement agencies of this state to access emergency 13 14 contact information and to view a communication impediment 15 designation that the holder of an official state personal 16 identification card has voluntarily provided to the secretary of 17 state. As used in this subsection, "emergency contact information" 18 means the name, telephone number, or address of an individual that 19 is used for the sole purpose of contacting that individual when the 20 holder of an official state personal identification card has been 21 involved in an emergency.
 - (20) If an applicant provides proof to the secretary of state that he or she is a minor who has been emancipated under 1968 PA 293, MCL 722.1 to 722.6, the official state personal identification card must bear the designation of the individual's emancipated status in a manner prescribed by the secretary of state.
- (21) The secretary of state shall inquire of each individual
 who applies for or who holds an official state personal
 identification card, in person or by mail, whether he or she agrees



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- 1 to participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101
- 2 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123.
- 3 An individual who has agreed to participate in the donor registry
- 4 is not considered to have revoked that agreement solely because the
- 5 individual's official state personal identification card has
- 6 expired. Enrollment in the donor registry is a legal agreement that
- 7 remains binding and in effect after the donor's death regardless of
- 8 the expressed desires of the deceased donor's next of kin who may
- 9 oppose the donor's anatomical gift.
- 10 (22) A valid official state personal identification card
- 11 presented by the individual to whom the card is issued is
- 12 considered the same as a valid state of Michigan driver license
- 13 when identification is requested except as otherwise specifically
- 14 provided by law.
- 15 (23) As used in this section:
- 16 (a) "Communication impediment" means an individual has a
- 17 health condition that may impede communication with a police
- 18 officer, including, but not limited to, the following:
- 19 (i) Deafness or hearing loss.
- 20 (ii) An autism spectrum disorder.
- 21 (b) "Emergency contact information" means the name, telephone
- 22 number, or address of an individual that is used for the sole
- 23 purpose of contacting that individual when the holder of an
- 24 official state personal identification card has been involved in an
- 25 emergency.
