## **HOUSE BILL NO. 5874**

June 18, 2020, Introduced by Reps. Hertel, Hammoud, Kuppa, Hood, Cynthia Johnson, Peterson, Manoogian, Gay-Dagnogo, Camilleri, Garza, Tyrone Carter, Bolden and Stone and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 17751 (MCL 333.17751), as amended by 2020 PA 4, and by adding section 17751a.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 17751. (1) A pharmacist shall not dispense a drug
- 2 requiring a prescription under the federal act or a law of this
- 3 state except under authority of an original prescription or an
- 4 equivalent record of an original prescription approved by the
- 5 board. A pharmacist described in section 17742b(2) may dispense a





- 1 drug pursuant to an original prescription received at a remote
- 2 pharmacy if the pharmacist receives, reviews, and verifies an exact
- 3 digital image of the prescription received at the remote pharmacy
- 4 before the drug is dispensed at the remote pharmacy.
- 5 (2) Subject to subsections (1) and (5), a pharmacist may
- 6 dispense a prescription written and signed; written or created in
- 7 an electronic format, signed, and transmitted by facsimile; or
- 8 transmitted electronically or by other means of communication by a
- 9 physician prescriber, dentist prescriber, or veterinarian
- 10 prescriber in another state, but not including a prescription for a
- 11 controlled substance except under circumstances described in
- 12 section 17763(e), only if the pharmacist in the exercise of his or
- 13 her professional judgment determines all of the following:
- 14 (a) Except as otherwise authorized under section 5110, 17744a,
- 15 or 17744b, if the prescriber is a physician or dentist, that the
- 16 prescription was issued pursuant to an existing physician-patient
- 17 or dentist-patient relationship.
- 18 (b) That the prescription is authentic.
- 19 (c) That the prescribed drug is appropriate and necessary for
- 20 the treatment of an acute, chronic, or recurrent condition.
- 21 (3) A pharmacist or a prescriber shall dispense a prescription
- 22 only if the prescription falls within the scope of practice of the
- 23 prescriber.
- 24 (4) A pharmacist shall not knowingly dispense a prescription
- 25 after the death of the prescriber or patient.
- 26 (5) A pharmacist shall not dispense a drug or device under a
- 27 prescription transmitted by facsimile or created in electronic
- 28 format and printed out for use by the patient unless the document
- 29 is manually signed by the prescriber. This subsection does not



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apply to any of the following: 1

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- (a) A prescription that is transmitted by a computer to a facsimile machine if that prescription complies with section 17754.
- 4 (b) A prescription that is received by a remote pharmacy and 5 made available to a pharmacist described in section 17742b(2) for review and verification in the manner required under subsection 7 (1).
- 8 (6) After consultation with and agreement from the prescriber, 9 a pharmacist may add or change a patient's address, a dosage form, 10 a drug strength, a drug quantity, a direction for use, or an issue 11 date with regard to a prescription. A pharmacist shall note the 12 details of the consultation and agreement required under this subsection on the prescription or, if the drug is dispensed at a 13 14 remote pharmacy, on the digital image of the prescription described 15 in subsection (1), and shall maintain that documentation with the prescription as required in section 17752. A pharmacist shall not 16 change the patient's name, controlled substance prescribed unless 17 18 authorized to dispense a lower cost generically equivalent drug product under section 17755, or the prescriber's signature with 19 20 regard to a prescription.
  - (7) A prescription that is contained within a patient's chart in a health facility or agency licensed under article 17 or other medical institution and that is transmitted to a pharmacy under section 17744 is the original prescription. If all other requirements of this part are met, a pharmacist shall dispense a drug or device under a prescription described in this subsection. A pharmacist may dispense a drug or device under a prescription described in this subsection even if the prescription does not contain the quantity ordered. If a prescription described in this



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- 1 subsection does not contain the quantity ordered, the pharmacist
- 2 shall consult with the prescriber to determine an agreed-upon
- 3 quantity. The pharmacist shall record the quantity dispensed on the
- 4 prescription and shall maintain that documentation with the
- 5 prescription as required in section 17752.
- **6** (8) If, after consulting with a patient, a pharmacist
- 7 determines in the exercise of his or her professional judgment that
- 8 dispensing additional quantities of a prescription drug is
- 9 appropriate for the patient, the pharmacist may dispense, at one
- 10 time, additional quantities of the prescription drug up to the
- 11 total number of dosage units authorized by the prescriber on the
- 12 original prescription for the patient and any refills of the
- 13 prescription. Except for a controlled substance included in
- 14 schedule 5 that does not contain an opioid, this subsection does
- 15 not apply to a prescription for a controlled substance.
- 16 (9) Subsections (6) and (8) are subject to section 17751a.
- 17 Sec. 17751a. (1) If the governor issues a qualified executive
- 18 order, a pharmacist may dispense an emergency refill of up to a 60-
- 19 day supply of a prescription drug other than a controlled substance
- 20 for a resident of this state if, in the pharmacist's professional
- 21 judgment, a failure to refill the prescription might interrupt the
- 22 patient's ongoing care and have a significant adverse effect on the
- 23 patient's well-being. All of the following apply for purposes of
- 24 this section:
- 25 (a) The pharmacist shall inform the patient that the
- 26 prescription was dispensed under this section.
- 27 (b) The pharmacist shall inform the prescriber, in writing and
- 28 within a reasonable period of time, of any refills that the
- 29 pharmacist dispensed under this section.



- 1 (c) Before refilling a prescription under this section, the
- 2 pharmacist shall make a reasonable effort to communicate with the
- 3 prescriber regarding refilling the prescription and make a record
- 4 of the effort made, including the reason for refilling a
- 5 prescription under this subdivision.
- 6 (2) As used in this section, "qualified executive order" means
- 7 an executive order issued by the governor in which both of the
- 8 following apply:
- 9 (a) The executive order is issued during a declared state of
- 10 emergency under any of the following:
- 11 (i) The emergency management act, 1976 PA 390, MCL 30.401 to
- 12 30.421.
- 13 (ii) 1945 PA 302, MCL 10.31 to 10.33.
- 14 (b) The executive order directs residents of this state to
- 15 remain in their residences, with limited exceptions, for at least 2
- 16 weeks.
