HOUSE BILL NO. 6110

August 17, 2020, Introduced by Reps. Paquette and Meerman and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1969 PA 306, entitled "Administrative procedures act of 1969,"

by amending section 92 (MCL 24.292), as amended by 2014 PA 540.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 92. (1) Before beginning proceedings for the suspension,
- 2 revocation, annulment, withdrawal, recall, cancellation or
- 3 amendment of a license, an agency shall give notice, personally or
- 4 by mail, to the licensee of facts or conduct that warrants the
- 5 intended action. The licensee shall must be given an opportunity to





- 1 show compliance with all lawful requirements for retention of the
- 2 license except as otherwise provided in any of the following:
- 3 (a) The support and parenting time enforcement act, 1982 PA
- 4 295, MCL 552.601 to 552.650.
- 5 (b) The regulated occupation support enforcement act, 1996 PA
- 6 236, MCL 338.3431 to 338.3436.
- 7 (c) Section 41309 of the natural resources and environmental
- 8 protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.41309.
- 9 (2) If Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3), if the
- 10 agency finds that the public health, safety, or welfare requires
- 11 emergency action and incorporates this finding in its order,
- 12 summary suspension of a license may be ordered effective on the
- 13 date specified in the order or on service of a certified copy of
- 14 the order on the licensee, whichever is later, and effective during
- 15 the proceedings. The proceedings shall must be promptly commenced
- 16 and determined.
- 17 (3) An agency shall not order summary suspension of a license
- 18 under subsection (2) for a violation of an executive order issued
- 19 by the governor during a state of disaster or emergency declared
- 20 under the emergency management act, 1976 PA 390, MCL 30.401 to
- 21 30.421, or 1945 PA 302, MCL 10.31 to 10.33, relating to COVID-19.
- 22 This subsection does not apply if the licensee's conduct would be a
- 23 ground for summary suspension of a license under the laws of this
