## **HOUSE BILL NO. 6292**

October 07, 2020, Introduced by Rep. Hernandez and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1974 PA 258, entitled "Mental health code,"

(MCL 330.1001 to 330.2106) by adding sections 273a and 273b.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 273a. The department shall create and operate a grant
- 2 program to provide grants to high schools that are specifically
- 3 designated for students recovering from a substance use disorder.





- 1 Each year from available funds, the department shall award grants
- 2 under this section to support the costs of counselors, therapeutic
- 3 staff, and recovery coaching staff at high schools described in
- 4 this section. In granting an application, the department shall
- 5 place a priority based on the applicant's cost of providing
- 6 substance use disorder counselors. Each grant that the department
- 7 awards under this section shall not exceed \$150,000.00 per
- 8 applicant.
- 9 Sec. 273b. The department shall create and operate a
- 10 competitive grant program to provide grants to recovery community
- 11 organizations. Each year from available funds, the department shall
- 12 award grants under this section to recovery community organizations
- 13 to offer or expand recovery support center services or recovery
- 14 community center services to individuals seeking long-term recovery
- 15 from substance use disorders. Each grant that the department awards
- 16 under this section shall not exceed \$150,000.00 per applicant. In
- 17 awarding a grant, the department shall place priority on recovery
- 18 community organizations that do all of the following:
- 19 (a) Provide recovery support navigation that includes the
- 20 following:
- 21 (i) Multiple recovery pathways.
- 22 (ii) Assistance for individuals navigating recovery resources
- 23 such as detoxification, treatment, recovery housing, support
- 24 groups, peer support, and family support.
- 25 (iii) The promotion of community wellness and engagement.
- 26 (iv) Recovery advocacy that provides hope and encourages
- 27 recovery.
- 28 (v) A peer-led, peer-driven organization that offers recovery
- 29 to any individual seeking recovery from addiction.



- 1 (b) Provide recovery outreach education that includes the 2 following:
- 3 (i) On-site recovery education in the workplace.
- 4 (ii) All-staff employee meetings.
- 5 (iii) On-site support for employees and family members.
- 6 (iv) Connections for employees and family members of employees
- 7 suffering from addiction to local recovery resources such as
- 8 treatment, recovery housing, and support groups.
- 9 (v) Connections with employers to provide recovery advocacy.
- 10 (c) Provide recovery activities and events that include the
- 11 following:
- 12 (i) Safe, ongoing recovery activities and events.
- 13 (ii) Opportunities to volunteer and participate in activities
- 14 and events.
- 15 (iii) Opportunities for family members and supporters of
- 16 recovery to be involved.
- 17 (iv) Meetings and activities on nutrition, health, and
- 18 wellness.
- 19 (v) Meetings and activities on mindfulness, meditation, and
- 20 yoga.
