- (5) (4)—The sheriff or local law enforcement officer shall 4 conduct the sale and shall deposit from the proceeds of the sale an 5 6 amount equal to the fine and court costs provided in required under 7 subsection (1) with the court in which the transient merchant was 8 convicted. Any proceeds of the sale which that exceed the fine 9 shall must be returned to the transient merchant. Any sheriff or 10 local law enforcement officer disposing of property in the manner 11 provided in this act shall is not be liable to the transient 12 merchant for the sale.
