HOUSE BILL NO. 6481

December 02, 2020, Introduced by Rep. LaGrand and referred to the Committee on Local Government and Municipal Finance.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 267, entitled "Open meetings act,"

by amending section 8 (MCL 15.268), as amended by 2018 PA 467.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 8. A public body may meet in a closed session only for
 the following purposes:
- 3 (a) To consider the dismissal, suspension, or disciplining of,
- 4 or to hear complaints or charges brought against, or to consider a
- 5 periodic personnel evaluation of, a public officer, employee, staff
- 6 member, or individual agent, if the named person requests a closed

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- 1 hearing. A person requesting a closed hearing may rescind the
- 2 request at any time, in which case the matter at issue shall must
- 3 be considered after the rescission only in open sessions.
- 4 (b) To consider the dismissal, suspension, or disciplining of
- 5 a student if the public body is part of the school district,
- 6 intermediate school district, or institution of higher education
- 7 that the student is attending, and if the student or the student's
- 8 parent or quardian requests a closed hearing.
- 9 (c) For strategy and negotiation sessions connected with the
- 10 negotiation of a collective bargaining agreement if either
- 11 negotiating party requests a closed hearing.
- 12 (d) To consider the purchase or lease of real property up to
- 13 the time an option to purchase or lease that real property is
- 14 obtained.
- 15 (e) To consult with its attorney regarding trial or settlement
- 16 strategy in connection with specific pending litigation, but only
- 17 if an open meeting would have a detrimental financial effect on the
- 18 litigating or settlement position of the public body.
- 19 (f) To review and consider the contents of an application for
- 20 employment or appointment to a public office if the candidate
- 21 requests that the application remain confidential. However, except
- 22 as otherwise provided in this subdivision, all interviews by a
- 23 public body for employment or appointment to a public office shall
- 24 must be held in an open meeting pursuant to under this act. This
- 25 subdivision does not apply to a public office described in
- 26 subdivision (j).
- 27 (g) Partisan caucuses of members any of the following:
- 28 (i) Members of the state legislature.
- 29 (ii) Members of a county board of commissioners.

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- (h) To consider material exempt from discussion or disclosure
 by state or federal statute.
- 3 (i) For a compliance conference conducted under section 16231
 4 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.16231, before a
 5 complaint is issued.
- (j) In the process of searching for and selecting a president of an institution of higher education established under section 4, 5, or 6 of article VIII of the state constitution of 1963, to review the specific contents of an application, to conduct an interview with a candidate, or to discuss the specific qualifications of a candidate if the particular process of searching for and selecting a president of an institution of higher

education meets all of the following requirements:

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- (i) The search committee in the process, appointed by the governing board, consists of at least 1 student of the institution, 1 faculty member of the institution, 1 administrator of the institution, 1 alumnus of the institution, and 1 representative of the general public. The search committee also may include 1 or more members of the governing board of the institution, but the number shall must not constitute a quorum of the governing board. However, the search committee shall not be constituted in such a way that any 1 of the groups described in this subparagraph constitutes a majority of the search committee.
- (ii) After the search committee recommends the 5 final candidates, the governing board does not take a vote on a final selection for the president until at least 30 days after the 5 final candidates have been publicly identified by the search committee.
- (iii) The deliberations and vote of the governing board of the

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- 1 institution on selecting the president take place in an open
- 2 session of the governing board.
- 3 (k) For a school board to consider security planning to
- 4 address existing threats or prevent potential threats to the safety
- 5 of the students and staff. As used in this subdivision, "school
- 6 board" means any of the following:
- 7 (i) That term as defined in section 3 of the revised school
- 8 code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.3.
- 9 (ii) An intermediate school board as **that term is** defined in
- 10 section 4 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.4.
- 11 (iii) A board of directors of a public school academy as
- 12 described in section 502 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451,
- **13** MCL 380.502.
- 14 (iv) The local governing board of a public community or junior
- 15 college as described in section 7 of article VIII of the state
- 16 constitution of 1963.
