HOUSE BILL NO. 6529

December 17, 2020, Introduced by Rep. LaGrand and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled $\mbox{"The revised school code,"}$

by amending section $1177 \, (MCL \, 380.1177)$, as amended by 2013 PA 121.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1177. (1) A child enrolling in a public or nonpublic
- 2 school for the first time or , beginning in the 2014-2015 school
- 3 year, enrolling in grade 2, 5, or 7 for the first time shall submit
- 4 1 of the following:

- (b) A statement signed by a parent or guardian to the effect
 that the child has not been immunized because of religious
 convictions or other objection to immunization.
- 8 (c) A statement signed by a physician that certifies that the
 9 child is in the process of complying with all immunization
 10 requirements.
- 11 (2) In addition, the parent or guardian of each child enrolling in kindergarten for the first time shall submit a 12 13 statement signed by a district, county, or city health department 14 director stating that the child has been administered the 15 department of community health and human services preschool vision 16 screening test, or signed by a licensed medical or osteopathic 17 physician or a licensed optometrist stating that the child's eyes 18 have been examined during the preschool years after age 3 and before initial entrance. A vision test is not required if there is 19 20 a statement signed by a parent or guardian to the effect that the 21 child cannot be submitted to the test because of religious 22 convictions.
 - (3) Not later than November 1 of each year, the administrator of each school shall provide the director of the department of community health and human services with the immunization status of each pupil in grades K through 12 who enrolled in the school for the first time, or , beginning in the 2014-2015 school year, enrolled in grade 2, 5, or 7 in the school for the first time, between the immediately preceding January 1 and the immediately

- 1 preceding September 30, as well as a vision report of each child
- 2 entering kindergarten during that time period. This information
- 3 shall must be transmitted through the approved local full-time
- 4 health department, if available, and shall must be on forms
- 5 provided by the director of community the department of health and
- 6 human services or otherwise reported in a manner approved by the
- 7 director of the department of community health and human services.
- 8 Not later than February 1 of each year, the administrator of each
- 9 school shall provide an update to the report due the previous
- 10 November 1 to show the immunization status of each pupil in grades
- 11 K through 12 who enrolled in the school for the first time, or τ
- 12 beginning in the 2014-2015 school year, enrolled in grade 2, 5, or

- 17 (4) Beginning in the 2021-2022 school year, within 10 days
- 18 after submitting the information required under subsection (3) to
- 19 the director of the department of health and human services, the
- 20 board of a school district or intermediate school district or the
- 21 board of directors of a public school academy shall ensure that
- 22 each public school it operates complies with all of the following
- 23 concerning public reporting of the immunization status of pupils:
- 24 (a) Provides all of the following to the parent or legal
- 25 guardian of each pupil enrolled in the school by sending an
- 26 electronic mail to the electronic mail address it has on record for
- 27 the parent or legal guardian or, if it does not have an electronic
- 28 mail address on record, by United States mail to the mailing
- 29 address it has on record for the parent or legal guardian:

(i) Information concerning the immunization status of pupils enrolled in kindergarten or grade 2, 5, or 7 in the school, including at least the total number of pupils enrolled in each of those grades in the school, the total number of those pupils in each of those grades for whom the school has received a signed statement under subsection (1)(a) or (c), and the total number of those pupils in each of those grades for whom the school has received a waiver statement under subsection (1)(b).

- (ii) For a school district or intermediate school district, information concerning the immunization status of pupils enrolled in kindergarten or grade 2, 5, or 7 in all of the schools operated by the school district or intermediate school district, including at least the total number of pupils enrolled in each of those grades in the school district or intermediate school district, the total number of those pupils in each of those grades for whom the school district or intermediate school district has received a signed statement under subsection (1)(a) or (c), and the total number of those pupils in each of those grades for whom the school district or intermediate school district has received a waiver statement under subsection (1)(b).
- (b) Posts all of the information required under subdivision(a) on the school's public website, with a link from the homepage.
- (c) Posts a paper notice containing all of the information required under subdivision (a) in the main reception area of the school in a location within the plain view of the public.
- 26 (5) (4)—The department of community—health and human services 27 shall promulgate rules, including rules identifying the diseases 28 specified under subsection (1)(a), for the implementation of this 29 section.
