## **SENATE BILL NO. 182**

March 07, 2019, Introduced by Senator MCBROOM and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

A bill to amend 2012 PA 487, entitled "Wildlife depredations indemnification act,"

by amending sections 2 and 3 (MCL 285.362 and 285.363).

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Commission" means the commission of agriculture and rural3 development.
- 4 (b) "Department" means the department of agriculture and rural

5 development.

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- 1 (c) "Livestock" means that term as it is defined in section  $\frac{5}{}$
- 2 3 of the animal industry act, 1988 PA 466, MCL 287.705.MCL 287.703.
- 3 Sec. 3. (1) The department shall provide indemnification for
- 4 the death, injury, or loss of livestock from wolves, coyotes, and
- 5 cougars. Indemnification for missing animals shall only be paid if
- 6 there is a history of losses to the owner of livestock as evidenced
- 7 by a prior payment by the department due to the death or injury of
- 8 livestock from wolves.
- $\mathbf{9}$  (2) To be eligible for indemnification under subsection (1),
- 10 the owner of livestock shall do all of the following:
- 11 (a) Report the incident to the department within 24 hours
- 12 after the animal is discovered to be dead, injured, or missing.
- 13 (b) File a claim for indemnification with the department
- 14 verifying the type and number of animals for which indemnification
- 15 is sought. The verification may include photographs of the animals
- 16 or tracks or other information that provides support for the claim.
- 17 If the claim seeks indemnification for missing animals, a notarized
- 18 statement from the owner specifying the date of birth of each
- 19 missing animal and the date on which the animals were discovered
- 20 missing, along with evidence of prior indemnification payments due
- 21 to death or injury of livestock from wolves, is sufficient
- 22 documentation that 1 or more animals are missing and eligible for
- 23 indemnification.
- 24 (c) Upon request, provide the department of natural resources
- 25 with access to the owner's property as necessary to conduct an
- 26 investigation if the department of natural resources believes that
- 27 an on-site visit will assist its investigation.
- 28 (d) Upon request, provide the department with documentation
- 29 that the animals have official identification, if required under

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- 1 the animal industry act, 1988 PA 466, MCL 287.701 to
- 2 <del>287.746.</del>287.745.
- 3 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 4 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 5 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 6 unless Senate Bill No.174 of the 100th Legislature is enacted into
- 7 law.
