September 12, 2019, Introduced by Senator MCBROOM and referred to the Committee on Elections.

A bill to amend 1966 PA 261, entitled

"An act to provide for the apportionment of county boards of commissioners; to prescribe the size of the board; to provide for appeals; to prescribe the manner of election of the members of the county board of commissioners; to provide for compensation of members; to prescribe penalties and provide remedies; and to repeal acts and parts of acts,"

by amending section 11 (MCL 46.411), as amended by 2002 PA 158, and by adding section 11c.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 11. A candidate for the office of county commissioner

- 1 shall must be a resident and registered voter of the district that

- 4 Except as otherwise provided in section 11c, nominations and

- 19 decennial census and continuing until December 31 of the third year
- 20 following that date, the county board of commissioners of a county
- 21 with a population of less than 75,000 may adopt a resolution to
- 22 conduct nonpartisan elections for the office of county
- 23 commissioner. If a county board of commissioners adopts a
- 24 resolution as provided in this section, the resolution takes effect
- 25 on December 31 of the year in which the resolution is adopted.
- 26 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 27 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 28 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
