THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 539a. As used in sections 539a to 539i:
- 2 (1) "Private place" means a place where one may reasonably
- 3 expect to be safe from casual or hostile intrusion or surveillance

- but does not include a place to which the public or substantialgroup of the public has access.
- 3 (2) "Eavesdrop" or "eavesdropping" means to overhear, record,
 4 remotely access, amplify, or transmit any part of the private
 5 discourse of others without the permission of all persons engaged
 6 in the discourse. Neither this definition or nor any other
 7 provision of this act shall modify modifies or affect affects any
- 8 law or regulation concerning interception, divulgence or recording9 of messages transmitted by communications common carriers.
- 10 (3) "Surveillance" means to secretly observe the activities of
 11 another person for the purpose of spying upon and invading the
 12 privacy of the person observed, whether by physical or
 13 technological means, in a present or future time, whether or not
 14 the individual is aware of the presence of a device or the
 15 capabilities of that device to record, store a recording, or be
 16 remotely accessed.
- 17 (4) "Person" means any individual, partnership, corporation,18 or association.

Sec. 539b. A person who trespasses on property, either physically or remotely through the use of technology, that is owned or under the control of any other another person, to subject that person to eavesdropping or surveillance is quilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 539c. Any A person who is present or who is not present

during a private conversation and who wilfully willfully uses any device, including by accessing a device through technological means, to eavesdrop upon the conversation without the consent of all parties thereto, or who knowingly aids, employs, or procures another person to do the same in violation of this section, is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in a state prison for

- 1 not more than 2 years or by a fine of not more than \$2,000.00, or
- 2 both.
