A bill to amend 1953 PA 232, entitled "Corrections code of 1953,"

(MCL 791.201 to 791.285) by adding section 20.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 20. (1) If the department plans to close a correctional
- 2 facility, the department shall consider the potential economic

- 5 (2) Not less than 1 year before closing a correctional

- 1 facility, the department shall submit a report on the impact of and
- 2 the actual and projected savings from closing the correctional
- 3 facility to the appropriations subcommittees of the senate and
- 4 house of representatives concerned with corrections, the senate and
- 5 house fiscal agencies, the legislative corrections ombudsman, and
- 6 the state budget office. The report must be made available to the
- 7 public.
- 8 (3) The department shall include, but is not limited to
- 9 including, the following information in the report required under
- 10 subsection (2):
- 11 (a) Age of and cost to operate each correctional facility.
- 12 (b) Any need for additional improvements or renovations to a
- 13 correctional facility.
- 14 (c) Operational needs and custody levels of each correctional
- 15 facility.
- 16 (d) Capacity levels and current prisoner counts for each
- 17 correctional facility.
- 18 (e) Cost to relocate prisoners to another correctional
- 19 facility.
- 20 (f) Cost to relocate correctional officers and other employees
- 21 of the department.
- 22 (q) Distance between the correctional facility that may be
- 23 closed and other correctional facilities.
- 24 (h) Specialized programming that is offered at the
- 25 correctional facility that may be closed and any plan to continue
- 26 that specialized programming at another correctional facility.
- 27 (i) County unemployment rates.
- (j) The following information regarding each impacted local

- 1 (i) Potential job loss from the closure of the correctional
- 2 facility, and current number of unemployed workers and unemployment

- 4 (ii) Number of individuals who have graduated from high school
- 5 or obtained a high school equivalency certificate, or graduated
- 6 from community college or a career and technical education program.
- 7 (iii) Number of individuals with disabilities.
- 8 (iv) Number of assistance program recipients.
- 9 (v) Per capita personal income.
- 10 (vi) Population, labor force, and employment trends.
- 11 (vii) Five top employers.
- 12 (viii) Impact on schools, including, but not limited to,
- 13 enrollment and funding.
- 14 (ix) Impact on local vendors.
- 15 (4) The department shall provide in the report required under
- 16 subsection (2) the justification for the department's proposed
- 17 selection of a correctional facility for closure and a detailed
- 18 analysis of how the information under subsection (3) impacts the

- 20 (5) If the department determines it may close a correctional
- 21 facility, the department shall hold a public hearing to permit the
- 22 public a direct and comprehensive opportunity to recite any
- 23 concerns to the department regarding the proposed closure. The

- 25 (a) The hearing is in the community in which the correctional

- 1 (c) The hearing is held not less than 30 days after the report 2 under subsection (2) is made available to the public and not less 3 than 6 months before a correctional facility will be closed.
- 4 (6) The department shall cause the state agency responsible 5 for completing appraisals to perform a physical inspection and 6 appraisal of any correctional facility the department proposes to 7 close.
- 8 (7) As used in this section, "impacted local community" means
 9 the county and the city, township, or village in which an
 10 individual who is employed by the department in a correctional
 11 facility that may be closed resides.
