## **SENATE BILL NO. 760**

January 29, 2020, Introduced by Senators WOJNO, IRWIN, CHANG, BULLOCK, ANANICH, GEISS, POLEHANKI, MCMORROW, SANTANA, ALEXANDER, BAYER and HOLLIER and referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety.

A bill to amend 1939 PA 288, entitled "Probate code of 1939,"

by amending section 18e of chapter XIIA (MCL 712A.18e), as amended by 2018 PA 142.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

CHAPTER XIIA

Sec. 18e. (1) Except as **otherwise** provided in subsection (2),

a person who has been adjudicated of not more than 1 juvenile

offense that would be a felony if committed by an adult and not

- 1 more than 3 juvenile offenses, of which not more than 1 may be a
- 2 juvenile offense that would be a felony if committed by an adult
- 3 and who has no felony convictions may file an application with the
- 4 adjudicating court or adjudicating courts for the entry of an order
- 5 setting aside the adjudications. A person may have only 1
- 6 adjudication for an offense that would be a felony if committed by
- 7 an adult and not more than 2 adjudications for an offense that
- 8 would be a misdemeanor if committed by an adult or if there is no
- 9 adjudication for a felony if committed by an adult, not more than 3
- 10 adjudications for an offense that would be a misdemeanor if
- 11 committed by an adult set aside under this section. Multiple
- 12 adjudications arising out of a series of acts that were in a
- 13 continuous time sequence of 12 hours or less and that displayed a
- 14 single intent and goal constitute 1 offense provided that none of
- 15 the adjudications constitute any of the following:
- 16 (a) An assaultive crime as that term is defined in subsection
- **17** (7).
- 18 (b) An offense involving the use or possession of a weapon.
- (c) An offense with a maximum penalty of 10 or more yearsimprisonment.
- 21 (2) A person shall not apply under this section to have set
- 22 aside, and a judge shall not under this section set aside, any of
- 23 the following:
- 24 (a) An adjudication for an offense that if committed by an
- 25 adult would be a felony for which the maximum punishment is life
- 26 imprisonment.
- 27 (b) An adjudication for a traffic offense under the Michigan
- 28 vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, or a local
- 29 ordinance substantially corresponding to that act, that involves

- the operation of a vehicle and at the time of the violation is a
  felony or misdemeanor.
- 3 (c) A conviction under section 2d of this chapter. This
  4 subdivision does not prevent a person convicted under section 2d of
  5 this chapter from having that conviction set aside as otherwise
  6 provided by law.
- 7 (3) An application under this section shall must not be filed 8 until the expiration of 1 year following imposition of the 9 disposition for the adjudication that the applicant seeks to set 10 aside, or 1 year following completion of any term of detention for 11 that adjudication, or when the person becomes 18 years of age, 12 whichever occurs later.
- (4) An application under this section is invalid unless it
  contains the following information and is signed under oath by the
  person whose adjudication is to be set aside:
- 16 (a) The full name and current address of the applicant.
- (c) A statement that the applicant has not been adjudicated of
  a juvenile offense other than the juvenile offenses sought to be
  set aside as a result of this application.
- (d) A statement that the applicant has not been convicted ofany felony offense.
- (e) A statement as to whether the applicant has previously
  filed an application to set aside this or any other adjudication
  and, if so, the disposition of the application.
- (f) A statement as to whether the applicant has any othercriminal charge pending against him or her in any court in theUnited States or in any other country.

- (g) A consent to the use of the nonpublic record created under subsection (13), to the extent authorized by subsection (13).
- 3 (5) The applicant shall submit a copy of the application and 24 complete sets of fingerprints to the department of state police.
- 5 The department of state police shall compare those fingerprints
- 6 with the records of the department, including the nonpublic record
- 7 created under subsection (13), and shall forward a complete set of
- 8 fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a
- 9 comparison with the records available to that agency. The
- 10 department of state police shall report to the court in which the
- 11 application is filed the information contained in the department's
- 12 records with respect to any pending charges against the applicant,
- 13 any record of adjudication or conviction of the applicant, and the
- 14 setting aside of any adjudication or conviction of the applicant
- 15 and shall report to the court any similar information obtained from
- 16 the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The court shall not act upon
- 17 the application until the department of state police reports the
- 18 information required by this subsection to the court.
- 19 (6) The copy of the application submitted to the department of state police under subsection (5) shall must be accompanied by a fee of \$25.00 payable to the state of Michigan. The department of state police shall use the fee to defray the expenses incurred in
- 23 processing the application.

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- 24 (7) A copy of the application shall must be served upon the
- 25 attorney general and, if applicable, upon the office of the
- 26 prosecuting attorney who prosecuted the offense. The attorney
- 27 general and the prosecuting attorney shall have an opportunity to
- 28 contest the application. If the adjudication was for an offense
- 29 that if committed by an adult would be an assaultive crime or

- 1 serious misdemeanor, and if the name of the victim is known to the
- 2 prosecuting attorney, the prosecuting attorney shall give the
- 3 victim of that offense written notice of the application and
- 4 forward a copy of the application to the victim under section 46a
- 5 of the William Van Regenmorter crime victim's rights act, 1985 PA
- 6 87, MCL 780.796a. The notice shall must be sent by first-class mail
- 7 to the victim's last known address. The victim has the right to
- 8 appear at any proceeding under this section concerning that
- 9 adjudication and to make a written or oral statement. As used in
- 10 this subsection:
- 11 (a) "Assaultive crime" means that term as defined in section
- 12 9a of chapter X of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL
- **13** 770.9a.
- 14 (b) "Serious misdemeanor" means that term as defined in
- 15 section 61 of the William Van Regenmorter crime victim's rights
- 16 act, 1985 PA 87, MCL 780.811.
- 17 (c) "Victim" means that term as defined in section 31 of the
- 18 William Van Regenmorter crime victim's rights act, 1985 PA 87, MCL
- **19** 780.781.
- 20 (8) Upon the hearing of the application, the court may require
- 21 the filing of affidavits and the taking of proofs as it considers
- 22 proper.
- 23 (9) Except as provided in this subsection and subsection (10),
- 24 if the court determines that the circumstances and behavior of the
- 25 applicant from the date of the applicant's adjudication to the
- 26 filing of the application warrant setting aside the 1 adjudication
- 27 for a juvenile offense that would be a felony if committed by an
- 28 adult and not more than 2 adjudications for a juvenile offense that
- 29 would be a misdemeanor if committed by an adult or if there is no

- 1 adjudication for a felony if committed by an adult, not more than 3
- 2 adjudications for an offense that would be a misdemeanor if
- 3 committed by an adult and that setting aside the adjudication or
- 4 adjudications is consistent with the public welfare, the court may
- 5 enter an order setting aside the adjudication. If the applicant
- 6 submits to the court a certificate of completion from the Michigan
- 7 youth challeNGe academy showing that the applicant has completed
- 8 that program, the court shall determine that the applicant's
- 9 circumstances and behavior warrant setting aside the adjudication.
- 10 If the court also determines that setting aside the adjudication or
- 11 adjudications is consistent with the public welfare, the court may
- 12 enter an order setting aside the adjudication as provided in this
- 13 subsection. Except as provided in subsection (10), the setting
- 14 aside of an adjudication under this section is a privilege and
- 15 conditional, and is not a right.
- 16 (10) If the person files an application with the court and he
- 17 or she otherwise meets all the requirements, notwithstanding
- 18 subsection (9), the court shall set aside the adjudication of a
- 19 person as follows:
- 20 (a) The person was adjudicated for an offense that if
- 21 committed by an adult would be a violation or an attempted
- violation of section 413 of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328,
- **23** MCL 750.413.
- 24 (b) The person was adjudicated for an a juvenile offense that
- 25 if committed by an adult would be a violation or an attempted
- 26 violation of section 448, 449, or 450 of the Michigan penal code,
- 27 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.448, 750.449, and 750.450, or a local
- 28 ordinance substantially corresponding to section 448, 449, or 450
- 29 of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.448, 750.449, and

- $1 ext{750.450}$ , and he or she committed the offense as a direct result of
- 2 his or her being a victim of a human trafficking violation.
- 3 (11) Upon the entry of an order under this section, the
- 4 applicant is considered not to have been previously adjudicated,
- 5 except as provided in subsection (13) and as follows:
- **6** (a) The applicant is not entitled to the remission of any
- 7 fine, costs, or other money paid as a consequence of an
- 8 adjudication that is set aside.
- **9** (b) This section does not affect the right of the applicant to
- 10 rely upon the adjudication to bar subsequent proceedings for the
- 11 same offense.
- 12 (c) This section does not affect the right of a victim of an
- 13 offense to prosecute or defend a civil action for damages.
- 14 (d) This section does not create a right to commence an action
- 15 for damages for detention under the disposition that the applicant
- 16 served before the adjudication is set aside under this section.
- 17 (12) Upon the entry of an order under this section, the court
- 18 shall send a copy of the order to the arresting agency and the
- 19 department of state police.
- 20 (13) The department of state police shall retain a nonpublic
- 21 record of the order setting aside an adjudication for a juvenile
- 22 offense that would be a felony if committed by an adult and not
- 23 more than 2 juvenile offenses that would be misdemeanors if
- 24 committed by an adult or if there is no adjudication for a felony
- 25 if committed by an adult, not more than 3 adjudications for an
- 26 offense that would be a misdemeanor if committed by an adult and of
- 27 the record of the arrest, fingerprints, adjudication, and
- 28 disposition of the applicant in the case to which the order
- 29 applies. Except as provided in subsection (14), this nonpublic

- 1 record shall must be made available only to a court of competent
- 2 jurisdiction, an agency of the judicial branch of state government,
- 3 a law enforcement agency, a prosecuting attorney, the attorney
- 4 general, or the governor upon request and only for the following
- 5 purposes:
- **6** (a) Consideration in a licensing function conducted by an
- 7 agency of the judicial branch of state government.
- **8** (b) Consideration by a law enforcement agency if a person
- **9** whose adjudication has been set aside applies for employment with
- 10 the law enforcement agency.
- 11 (c) To show that a person who has filed an application to set
- 12 aside an adjudication has previously had an adjudication set aside
- 13 under this section.
- 14 (d) The court's consideration in determining the sentence to
- 15 be imposed upon conviction for a subsequent offense that is
- 16 punishable as a felony or by imprisonment for more than 1 year.
- 17 (e) Consideration by the governor, if a person whose
- 18 adjudication has been set aside applies for a pardon for another
- 19 offense.
- 20 (14) A copy of the nonpublic record created under subsection
- 21 (13) shall must be provided to the person whose adjudication is set
- 22 aside under this section upon payment of a fee determined and
- 23 charged by the department of state police in the same manner as the
- 24 fee prescribed in section 4 of the freedom of information act, 1976
- **25** PA 442, MCL 15.234.
- 26 (15) The nonpublic record maintained under subsection (13) is
- 27 exempt from disclosure under the freedom of information act, 1976
- 28 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 29 (16) Except as provided in subsection (13), a person, other

- 1 than the applicant, who knows or should have known that an
- 2 adjudication was set aside under this section, who divulges, uses,
- 3 or publishes information concerning an adjudication set aside under
- 4 this section is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 5 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 6 after the date it is enacted into law.
