A bill to require employers to post information concerning coronavirus testing sites; and to prohibit certain acts and provide sanctions.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Coronavirus" means coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).
- 3 (b) "Employee" means an individual who performs a service for
- 4 wages or other remuneration under a contract of hire, written or
- 5 oral, express or implied.
- 6 (c) "Employer" means a person that has 1 or more employees.

- Employer includes an agent of the employer, this state, and apolitical subdivision of this state.
- 3 (d) "Local health department" means that term as defined in4 section 1105 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.1105.
- 5 (e) "Person" means an individual, partnership, corporation,6 association, or other legal entity.
- Sec. 3. (1) An employer shall provide its employees with a notice of all locations in the county in which the employer is located that perform coronavirus testing. The employer shall keep the notice posted at the work site in a conspicuous place where employees may conveniently read it.
- 12 (2) The employer shall verify the information contained in the 13 notice under subsection (1) with a local health department from the 14 county in which the employer is located and ensure the notice 15 remains up-to-date.
- Sec. 5. An employer that violates this act may be ordered to 17 pay a civil fine of not more than \$500.00. A violation of this act 18 may be prosecuted by the prosecutor in the county in which the 19 violation occurred, or by the attorney general.
