A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

(MCL 257.1 to 257.923) by adding section 811aa.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 811aa. (1) The secretary of state shall develop under
- 2 section 811e and issue under section 811f a fund-raising plate
- 3 recognizing the Upper Peninsula. The secretary of state in
- 4 conjunction with the Great Lakes Sports Commission shall design the

- 1 fund-raising plate authorized in this section. The fund-raising
- 2 plate authorized in this section must include the outline of the
- 3 map of the Upper Peninsula.
- 4 (2) The owner of a vehicle required to be registered under
- 5 this act may apply, on a form prescribed by the secretary of state,
- 6 for a fund-raising plate recognizing the Upper Peninsula as
- 7 prescribed in section 811f instead of a standard registration
- 8 plate.
- 9 (3) The secretary of state shall transfer the donation money
- 10 from the sale of fund-raising plates recognizing the Upper
- 11 Peninsula to the state treasurer, who shall credit the donation
- 12 money to the Great Lakes Sports Commission fund established under
- 13 subsection (4).
- 14 (4) The Great Lakes Sports Commission fund is created within
- 15 the state treasury. The state treasurer may receive money or other
- 16 assets from any source for deposit into the fund. The state
- 17 treasurer shall direct the investment of the fund. The state
- 18 treasurer shall credit to the fund interest and earnings from fund
- 19 investments. Money in the fund at the close of the fiscal year
- 20 shall remain in the fund and shall not lapse to the general fund.
- 21 (5) The state treasurer shall disburse money in the fund on a
- 22 quarterly basis to the Great Lakes Sports Commission. Beginning not
- 23 later than March 31, 2021, the Great Lakes Sports Commission shall
- 24 submit to the state treasurer a summary of the expenditures during
- 25 the preceding year of the money received under this section.
