THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 234d. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), a person
- 2 shall not possess a firearm on the premises of any of the
- 3 following:
- 4 (a) A depository financial institution or a subsidiary or
- 5 affiliate of a depository financial institution.
- 6 (b) A church or other house of religious worship.

- 1 (c) A court.
- 2 (d) A theatre.
- 3 (e) A sports arena.
- 4 (f) A day care center.
- 5 (g) A hospital.
- 6 (h) An establishment licensed under the Michigan liquor
- 7 control act, Act No. 8 of the Public Acts of the Extra Session of
- 8 1933, being sections 436.1 to 436.58 of the Michigan Compiled
- 9 Laws.code of 1998, 1998 PA 58, MCL 436.1101 to 436.2303.
- 10 (i) The Michigan State Capitol Building.
- 11 (2) This section does not apply to any of the following:
- 12 (a) A person who owns, or is employed by or contracted by, an
- 13 entity described in subsection (1) if the possession of that
- 14 firearm is to provide security services for that entity.
- 15 (b) A peace officer.
- 16 (c) A person licensed by this state or another state to carry
- 17 a concealed weapon.
- 18 (d) A person who possesses a firearm on the premises of an
- 19 entity described in subsection (1) if that possession is with the
- 20 permission of the owner or an agent of the owner of that entity.
- 21 (3) A person who violates this section is guilty of a
- 22 misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90 days or
- 23 a fine of not more than \$100.00, or both.
