October 21, 2020, Introduced by Senator HOLLIER and referred to the Committee on Families, Seniors, and Veterans.

A bill to create the space force task force in the department of military and veterans affairs and to prescribe its powers and duties; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state governmental officers and entities.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Adjutant general" means the adjutant general of this
- 3 state.
- 4 (b) "Space force" means the space warfare branch of the United
- 5 States Armed Forces.
- 6 (c) "Task force" means the space force task force created in

- 2 Sec. 3. (1) The space force task force is created in the
- 3 department of military and veterans affairs.
- 4 (2) The task force consists of all of the following members:
- 5 (a) The adjutant general.
- **6** (b) The director of the department of labor and economic
- 7 opportunity.
- 8 (c) A member of the public, appointed by the governor with the
- 9 advice and consent of the senate.
- 10 (d) Two members of the house of representatives, appointed by
- 11 the republican leader of the house of representatives.
- 12 (e) Two members of the house of representatives, appointed by
- 13 the democratic leader of the house of representatives.
- 14 (f) Two members of the senate, appointed by the republican
- 15 leader of the senate.
- 16 (q) Two members of the senate, appointed by the democratic
- 17 leader of the senate.
- 18 (3) The first members appointed to the task force must be
- 19 appointed no later than 60 days after the effective date of this
- **20** act.
- 21 (4) Members of the task force shall serve for 2 years.
- 22 (5) A vacancy on the task force must be filled in the same
- 23 manner as the original appointment. A member of the task force
- 24 appointed to fill a vacancy must be appointed for the balance of

- 26 (6) The individual who appointed a member of the task force
- 27 may remove that member of the task force for incompetence,

- 1 (7) The adjutant general shall call the first meeting of the
- ${f 2}$ task force no later than 30 days after the first members of the
- 3 task force are appointed. At the first meeting, the task force
- 4 shall elect from among its members a chairperson and other officers
- 5 it considers necessary or appropriate. After the first meeting, the
- 6 task force shall meet at the call of the chairperson or if
- 7 requested by 6 or more members of the task force.
- 8 (8) A majority of the members of the task force constitute a
- 9 quorum for the transaction of business at a meeting of the task
- 10 force. A majority of the members present and serving are required
- 11 for official action of the task force.
- 12 (9) The business that the task force may perform must be
- 13 conducted at a public meeting of the task force held in compliance
- 14 with the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275.
- 15 (10) A writing prepared, owned, used, in the possession of, or
- 16 retained by the task force in the performance of an official
- 17 function is subject to the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442,
- **18** MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 19 (11) Members of the task force shall serve without
- 20 compensation. However, members of the task force may be reimbursed
- 21 for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance
- 22 of their official duties as members of the task force.
- 23 Sec. 5. The task force shall do all of the following:
- 24 (a) Work with the department of military and veterans affairs,
- 25 the department of labor and economic opportunity, and the
- 26 department of technology, management, and budget to ensure this
- 27 state is as competitive as possible as a candidate for the site of
- 28 the space force's headquarters.
- 29 (b) Work with the United States Department of Defense to

- 1 ascertain and understand the space force's needs and expectations.
- (c) Organize veterans' service groups and key stakeholders
 around the recruitment and development of industries necessary to
 make this state a competitive candidate for the site of the space
 force's headquarters.
- 6 (d) Not more than 1 year after the effective date of this act,
 7 prepare and present a report to the governor, and the house of
 8 representatives and senate standing committees that primarily
 9 address legislation relating to military and veterans affairs, that
 10 contains recommendations on necessary actions to make this state a
 11 competitive candidate for the site of the space force's
 12 headquarters.
