HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 11

Reps. Cambensy, LaFave, Markkanen, Vaupel, Hertel and Elder offered the following concurrent resolution:

1 A concurrent resolution to urge the Centers for Medicare and

2 Medicaid Services to promptly approve a variance regarding shared

3 bathroom facilities at the D.J. Jacobetti Home for Veterans.

4 Whereas, The D.J. Jacobetti Home for Veterans provides a home-

5 like environment that meets a range of care needs, including

6 skilled nursing care. Former service members choose the D.J.

7 Jacobetti Home for Veterans for the unique environment it provides,

which includes the comradery gained by living with other veterans.

9 Because this population is predominantly male, it differs

10 significantly from most skilled nursing environments; and

11 Whereas, The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS)

12 requires skilled nursing facilities to equip each resident room

13 with its own bathroom. If a facility wants to provide shared





- 1 bathrooms, CMS must approve a variance, an exemption from these
- 2 federal regulations; and
- 3 Whereas, 105 of the 186 beds at the D.J. Jacobetti Home for
- 4 Veterans, all occupied by male residents, do not meet this bathroom
- 5 requirement because they offer shared bathroom facilities. This
- 6 means they are currently ineligible to be dually certified for
- 7 Medicare and Medicaid like the other 81 beds; and
- 8 Whereas, There are times when a veteran eligible for Medicare
- 9 or Medicaid benefits seeks placement in this facility, but the only
- 10 available beds are non-certified. Veterans face the difficult
- 11 position of choosing between receiving only partial benefits to be
- 12 able to stay at the D.J. Jacobetti Home for Veterans and being able
- 13 to use all of their entitled benefits, a right they have earned
- 14 through their service to our country; and
- 15 Whereas, The advantages gained by allowing veterans to fully
- 16 utilize the health benefits available to them by approving a
- 17 variance from CMS bathroom requirements far outweigh any potential
- 18 issues. Veterans deserve to be able to live where they choose
- 19 without sacrificing any of their health benefits; now, therefore,
- **20** be it
- 21 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
- 22 concurring), That we urge the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
- 23 Services to promptly approve a variance regarding shared bathroom
- 24 facilities at the D.J. Jacobetti Home for Veterans; and be it
- 25 further

- 27 Administrator of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services,
- 28 the Director of the Michigan Department of Health and Human
- 29 Services, and the Director of the Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency.
