HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 103

- 1 A resolution to honor the life of Judge Damon J. Keith.
- 2 Whereas, Damon J. Keith dedicated his illustrious life and
- 3 career to public service and justice. Born in the city of Detroit
- 4 on July 4, 1922, the grandson of slaves, Judge Keith graduated from
- 5 West Virginia State College in 1943 and was drafted into the United
- 6 States Army. His experiences in his segregated unit served as the

- 1 impetus for what would become a life dedicated to the pursuit of
- 2 justice and civil rights in America. After his military duty, he
- 3 sought and earned his law degree from Howard University in 1949
- 4 where he studied under future United States Supreme Court Justice
- 5 Thurgood Marshall. He later earned a Master of Laws degree from
- 6 Wayne State University in 1956; and
- 7 Whereas, Judge Keith began his career in private practice,
- 8 opening one of Detroit's first African-American law firms in 1964.
- 9 He quickly became drawn to public service and civic activism,
- 10 displaying a strong commitment toward helping address racial
- 11 discrimination, especially in the housing arena, in his beloved
- 12 community. He served as president of the Detroit Housing Commission
- 13 and was later appointed by Governor George Romney to serve as the
- 14 Chair of the Michigan Civil Rights Commission; and
- 15 Whereas, On September 25, 1967, Judge Keith was nominated by
- 16 President Lyndon B. Johnson and two weeks later was confirmed by
- 17 the U.S. Senate to the U.S. District Court for the Eastern
- 18 Division, later becoming the court's chief judge. On September 28,
- 19 1977, Judge Keith was nominated by President Jimmy Carter and
- 20 confirmed to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit. For
- 21 more than fifty years, he served on the federal bench as a
- 22 dedicated and persistent champion for equality for everyone in the
- 23 American jurisprudence system; and
- 24 Whereas, During Judge Keith's distinguished tenure on the
- 25 bench, he decided some of this country's most divisive issues,
- 26 courageously standing up against school segregation, governmental
- 27 surveillance of citizens, discriminatory and hostile work
- 28 environments fueled by sexual harassment; housing discrimination;
- 29 efforts to limit African-American voting; bad corporate actors that

- 1 engaged in racial discrimination; and secret hearings to deport
- 2 hundreds of immigrants deemed suspicious; and
- 3 Whereas, We will eternally be guided by the oft-quoted words
- 4 he penned in one of those cases, "Democracies die behind closed
- 5 doors. . . . When government begins closing doors, it selectively
- 6 controls information rightfully belonging to the people. Selective
- 7 information is misinformation"; and
- 8 Whereas, Beyond the bench, Judge Keith received countless
- 9 awards and accolades throughout his life, among them 40 honorary
- 10 doctorate degrees and the prestigious federal judiciary's Edward J.
- 11 Devitt Award. He was committed to numerous community activities,
- 12 including the YMCA, Boy Scouts, UNCF, the Detroit Symphony
- 13 Orchestra, the Detroit Arts Commission, Interlochen Arts Academy,
- 14 Sigma Phi Pi (Boule) and Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated;

- 16 Whereas, Judge Keith was loved by his friends and family,
- 17 respected by his colleagues, and admired by the many law clerks
- 18 whom he mentored and whose legal minds he helped to shape. He is
- 19 survived by his daughters, Debbie, Cecile and Gilda, two
- 20 granddaughters, and other relatives; now, therefore, be it
- 21 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 22 this legislative body honor the life of Judge Damon Keith. He was
- 23 brilliant man, a legal titan, and a tremendous crusader for civil
- 24 rights. His admirable legacy of courage, boldness, and
- 25 determination will long continue to enrich our state and nation;

- 27 Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 28 family of Damon Keith as a token of our esteem and an expression of
- 29 our highest tribute.
