- 1 A resolution to declare June 22, 2019, as Michigan Mountain
- 2 Biking Day in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, World-class biking experiences can be found in the
- 4 over 1,300 miles of mountain biking trails scattered throughout the
- 5 state of Michigan-from the tip of the Keweenaw Peninsula to metro
- 6 Detroit; and
- 7 Whereas, Michigan is home to a variety of trail challenges
- 8 including expert-level tracks with edgy bedrock and roots to smooth
- 9 flowing switchbacks. The diversity of Michigan's single-track
- 10 brings together every type of biker from beginners to world

- 1 champion racers. Michigan's diverse trails allow every cyclist to
- 2 find a trail that best suits their interests and comfort level; and
- 3 Whereas, Michigan proudly is home to two International
- 4 Mountain Bicycling Association Ride Centers, Copper Harbor and
- 5 Marquette. Only 40 of these mountain bike towns exist in the world.
- 6 The Copper Harbor and Marquette Ride Centers have been
- 7 internationally recognized for their exemplary design and
- 8 incredible rider experience. Additionally, the Copper Harbor trails
- 9 have been rated among the best in the country by National
- 10 Geographic and the Marquette trail system has been nationally
- 11 recognized by USA Today; and
- 12 Whereas, Michigan is also home to an International Mountain
- 13 Bicycling Association Epic trail, the High Country Pathway in the
- 14 Pigeon River Country State Forest near Vanderbilt. Only 42 IMBA
- 15 Epic trails exist in the United States. This 70-mile trail is known
- 16 for its backcountry adventure and elk viewing experiences; and
- 17 Whereas, The state's mountain biking trails connect thousands
- 18 of residents and visitors to the local economy. According to the
- 19 Outdoor Industry Foundation, nearly 45 million Americans mountain
- 20 bike each year. In Copper Harbor alone, their trails bring in more
- 21 than 20,000 bikers annually. The mountain biking tourism industry
- 22 provides a healthy boost to the Michigan communities who maintain
- 23 our renowned trails; and
- 24 Whereas, Michigan mountain biking trails provide healthy, fun
- 25 activities for all ages and connect bikers to the natural wonders
- 26 of Michigan's environment. Mountain biking trails in the state
- 27 provide unique opportunities for riders to experience up-close all
- 28 that our wilderness and lakes have to offer; now, therefore, be it
