## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.178

Reps. Bellino, Cherry, Garza, Hood, Love and Sabo offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare October 14-18, 2019, as Careers In
- 2 Energy Week in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, Access to affordable and reliable energy is
- 4 fundamental to the lives of all Michigan residents and crucial to
- 5 businesses; and
- 6 Whereas, Our energy industry is transforming energy generation
- 7 to cleaner, greener generation technologies and infrastructure as
- 8 older facilities are retired over the next 10 years. Energy-
- 9 efficiency and clean energy sources have become a priority for
- 10 Michigan residents, businesses, and governments; and
- 11 Whereas, Michigan's energy industry currently boasts 111,000
- 12 jobs, with this total demand projected to grow by 6 percent through

- 1 2026. This underscores a vital need to increase Science,
- 2 Technology, Engineering, Math (STEM) and skilled trades training to
- 3 increase the number of Michigan residents ready to fill the growing
- 4 gap in the workforce pipeline; and
- 5 Whereas, Michigan's economy continues to grow and become more
- 6 competitive and Michigan's energy providers have hired more than
- 7 3,200 employees since January 2018; and
- 8 Whereas, The Michigan Energy Workforce Development Consortium
- 9 (MEWDC) is a coalition of more than 50 representatives of industry,
- 10 education, workforce, labor, government and veterans celebrating 11
- 11 years of dedication to identifying and acting on current and future
- 12 workforce issues that are crucial to building and sustaining
- 13 Michigan's energy industry; and
- 14 Whereas, The MEWDC has partnered with the U.S. Department of
- 15 Labor, U.S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation and the Center for
- 16 Energy Workforce Development (CEWD) to implement talent development
- 17 strategies for employment opportunities in Michigan's energy
- 18 industry; and
- 19 Whereas, The MEWDC collaborated with the Michigan Department
- 20 of Education to create Michigan's 17th "career cluster," which
- 21 provides a roadmap for high school, career, and technical
- 22 education, and community college students to pursue jobs in the
- 23 energy sector; and
- 24 Whereas, MEWDC members now have an enhanced, year-round
- 25 presence in schools and on college and university campuses with a
- 26 focus on hiring Michigan students, offering expanded opportunities
- 27 for students to learn about working in Michigan's energy sector;

- 29 Whereas, During the week of October 14-18, MEWDC will focus on

- 1 energy career awareness through student tours, energy fairs, and
- 2 other events to raise awareness about the many benefits of energy
- 3 careers; now, therefore, be it

- 5 this legislative body declare October 14-18, 2019 as Careers in
- 6 Energy Week in the state of Michigan.
