

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.210

Reps. Whiteford, Calley, Garza, Gay-Dagnogo, Hood, Cynthia Johnson, Jones, Kahle, Kuppa, Lasinski, Leutheuser, Liberati, Love, Sabo, Schroeder, Shannon, Sneller, Sowerby, Stone, Witwer, Yancey and Yaroch offered the following resolution:

1 A resolution to declare January 11, 2020, as Human Trafficking
2 Awareness Day in the state of Michigan.

3 Whereas, Human trafficking is a modern-day form of slavery
4 involving the illegal trade of people for exploitation or
5 commercial gain; and

6 Whereas, Human trafficking is one of the fastest-growing
7 crimes in the world, second only to drug trafficking as the most
8 profitable form of crime, according to the U.S. Department of
9 State; and

10 Whereas, The best estimates indicate that approximately \$87



1 million per day is made off of sex trafficking victims; and

2 Whereas, Michigan gained national attention at both the state
3 and federal levels after passing effective legislation in 2013 and
4 2014 to help combat human trafficking and strengthen victim rights,
5 and was named the most improved state in 2015 for its laws
6 addressing child sex trafficking, according to Shared Hope
7 International. Michigan has gone from a rating of "F" in 2011, to a
8 "B" rating in 2019 according to Shared Hope International's
9 Protected Innocence Challenge study. While this state has made
10 considerable advances in fighting against human trafficking, we all
11 must understand that there is still work to be done; and

12 Whereas, This legislative body encourages all Michiganders to
13 use this day as an opportunity to educate themselves about human
14 trafficking and be aware of how prevalent it is in our state; and

15 Whereas, We support victims of human trafficking who have yet
16 to escape or be liberated and offer the gravest concern for those
17 who have had loved ones become victims to human trafficking; and

18 Whereas, We commend the individuals who have been victims of
19 trafficking, survived, and have overcome the atrocity, and continue
20 to support all who have dedicated themselves to putting an end to
21 human trafficking in Michigan; now, therefore, be it

22 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
23 this legislative body declare January 11, 2020, as Human
24 Trafficking Awareness Day in the state of Michigan.
