## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.330

Reps. Kuppa, Garza, Gay-Dagnogo, Hope, Cynthia Johnson, Koleszar, Love, Pohutsky, Sabo, Sneller, Sowerby, Stone, Wittenberg and Witwer offered the following resolution:

A resolution to recognize the historic, cultural, and
religious significance of the Festival of Diwali.

3 Whereas, Diwali is celebrated annually every autumn by Hindus,

4 Sikhs, and Jains in Michigan, the United States, and throughout the

5 world, with over 1 billion celebrants marking the holiday; and

6 Whereas, Diwali is a holy day, during which celebrants light

 ${f 7}$  small oil lamps and place them around the home. The lighting of

8 lamps is followed by prayers for attainment of health, wealth,

9 knowledge, peace, and valor, and is recognized as the beginning of

10 a new year for some Hindus; and

11 Whereas, The word "Diwali" is a shortened version of the

- 1 Sanskrit word "Deepavali", which means "a row of lamps"; and in
- 2 English is referred to as the "Festival of Lights;" and
- 3 Whereas, Celebrants of Diwali believe that the rows of lamps
- 4 symbolize the light within the individual that rids the soul of the
- 5 darkness of ignorance; and
- 6 Whereas, For Hindus, Diwali is a celebration of the belief
- 7 that light triumphs over darkness and good triumphs over evil; and
- 8 Whereas, For Sikhs, Diwali is feted as the day that the sixth
- 9 founding Sikh Guru, or revered teacher, Guru Hargobind, was
- 10 released from captivity by the Mughal Emperor Jehangir; and
- 11 Whereas, For Jains, Diwali marks the anniversary of the
- 12 attainment of moksha or liberation by Lord Mahavira, the last of
- 13 the Tirthankaras, who were the great teachers of Jain dharma, at
- 14 the end of his life in 527 B.C.; and
- 15 Whereas, Michigan remains resolute in its commitment to
- 16 continue fostering diversity of experience and religious acceptance
- 17 and Diwali is a time marked by qualities of togetherness, family,
- 18 and community; now, therefore, be it
- 19 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 20 this legislative body recognize the historic, cultural, and
- 21 religious significance of the Festival of Diwali. We recognize the
- 22 Diwali message of tolerance, compassion, and acceptance of others
- 23 which resonates with the ideals of the American spirit; and be it
- 24 further
- 25 Resolved, That we express respect and admiration to all those
- 26 who celebrate the Diwali Festival throughout the world and in our
- 27 own communities; and be it further
- 28 Resolved, That we call upon public officials and the citizens
- 29 of Michigan to acknowledge and appreciate those who celebrate

1 Diwali and the peace and prosperity that the holiday signifies.
