SENATE RESOLUTION NO.64

Senators Bumstead, Lucido, Bizon, Wojno, Outman, Bayer, Victory, VanderWall and Hollier, Alexander, Ananich, Brinks, Bullock, Johnson, MacDonald, McBroom, McCann, McMorrow and Santana offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to recognize July 2019 as Michigan Wildlife
- 2 Conservation Month.
- 3 Whereas, Michigan's natural beauty, abundant wildlife, and
- 4 plentiful waters are enjoyed from Belle Isle to Baraga by millions
- 5 of residents and visitors, and should be preserved and protected
- 6 for future generations; and
- 7 Whereas, Hunters and fishermen were among the first
- 8 conservationists, pushing for active wildlife management and
- 9 conservation to ensure wildlife would flourish forever; and

Whereas, Science-based wildlife management and conservation 1 decisions such as actively enhancing habitat, monitoring wildlife 2 populations, preventing the spread of disease, and regulating 3 hunting and fishing seasons help balance our use of natural 4 5 resources with the needs of Michigan's wildlife; and 6 Whereas, As a result of these protections, regulations, and 7 extensive conservation efforts, Michigan populations of elk, wild turkey, white-tailed deer, lake sturgeon, and many other species 8 have rebounded from near extinction; 11,000 inland lakes and 36,000 9 10 miles of rivers and streams are safeguarded from invasive species; 11 abundant wildlife habitat and wildfire risk are improved by forest 12 management; and Whereas, July 1, 2019, marks the eighty-first anniversary of 13 14 the effective date for the Pittman-Robertson Federal Aid in 15 Wildlife Restoration Act, which provides funding for wildlife management projects across the nation through the purchase of 16 17 hunting equipment; and Whereas, Hunting and fishing licenses, not state taxes, 18 19 provide tens of millions of dollars each year for wildlife 20 conservation; and Whereas, Annually, hunters and anglers contribute \$11.2 21 billion to Michigan's economy and create 171,000 jobs, making those 22 23 combined activities one of the state's top 10 job-creating industries, according to a recent study by the Michigan United 24 25 Conservation Clubs; and Whereas, This resolution coincides with the fifth anniversary 26 27 of the creation of the Michigan Wildlife Council, a bipartisan-28 approved panel entrusted with educating the public about the

importance of wildlife management in preserving Michigan's outdoor

- 2 Whereas, In large part because of the council's activities,
- 3 more Michiganders than ever before are aware of the essential role
- 4 hunting and fishing play in conserving, managing, and protecting
- 5 Michigan's wildlife; now, therefore, be it
- 6 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 7 body recognize July 2019 as Michigan Wildlife Conservation Month;
- 8 and be it further
- 9 Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 10 Michigan Wildlife Council.
