## SENATE RESOLUTION NO.67

Senator VanderWall, Alexander, Ananich, Brinks, Bullock, Geiss, Hollier, Johnson, Lucido, MacDonald, McCann, McMorrow, Polehanki, Santana and Wojno offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to recognize June 30-July 7, 2019, as Aquatic
- 2 Invasive Species Awareness Week.
- 3 Whereas, Michigan and its economy are defined by the Great
- 4 Lakes and depend on its great abundance of fresh water for
- 5 manufacturing, tourism, fishing, public water supplies,
- 6 agriculture, as well as its numerous other uses; and
- 7 Whereas, Preventing the introduction of aquatic invasive
- 8 species ultimately benefits Michigan, and stopping the introduction
- 9 of these species would eliminate the need for the state, its
- 10 businesses, industries, and citizens from employing costly methods

- 1 to control and manage them; and
- 2 Whereas, Michigan is protecting the Great Lakes from aquatic
- 3 invasive species from a number of pathways including ballast water,
- 4 canals and waterways, organisms in trade, and recreational
- 5 activities such as boating and angling; and
- 6 Whereas, Over 180 nonindigenous aquatic species are
- 7 established in the Great Lakes basin, many of which are displacing
- 8 native species, disrupting habitats, and degrading natural,
- 9 managed, and agricultural landscapes, resulting in millions of
- 10 dollars for control efforts each year; and
- 11 Whereas, Michigan has over 900,000 registered boaters and many
- 12 other recreational, commercial, and industrial users of over 11,000
- 13 inland lakes and over 36,000 miles of rivers and streams in the
- 14 state, many of which are impacted by aquatic invasive species; and
- 15 Whereas, Aquatic invasive species awareness is an important
- 16 first step toward behavior change, which prevents the introduction
- 17 and spread of aquatic invasive species; and
- 18 Whereas, Spring marks the beginning of water-related
- 19 recreational activities in Michigan; and
- 20 Whereas, Aquatic Invasive Species Awareness Week is an
- 21 opportunity for our state government to join forces with
- 22 businesses, industries, environmental groups, community
- 23 organizations, citizens, and the other Great Lakes states and
- 24 provinces to take action against the introduction and spread of
- 25 aquatic invasive species; now, therefore, be it
- 26 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 27 body recognize June 30-July 7, 2019, as Aquatic Invasive Species
- 28 Awareness Week; and be it further
- 29 Resolved, That all citizens must increase their understanding

- 1 and awareness of aquatic invasive species, their environmental and
- 2 economic impacts, and take preventative measures to stop the spread
- 3 and introduction of aquatic invasive species; and be it further
- 4 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 5 Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy,
- 6 Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development, Michigan
- 7 Department of Natural Resources, Michigan Department of
- 8 Transportation, Great Lakes Fishery Commission, Council of Great
- 9 Lakes Governors, Michigan Congressional Delegation, and Great Lakes
- 10 Commission.
