SENATE RESOLUTION NO.70

Senator VanderWall, Ananich, Barrett, Bizon, Bullock, Chang, Hertel, Hollier, Johnson, Lauwers, Lucido, Runestad, Santana, Wojno and Zorn offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to recognize September 7, 2019, as Great Lakes-
- 2 St. Lawrence Appreciation Day.
- 3 Whereas, The Great Lakes system including Lake Erie, Lake
- 4 Huron, Lake Ontario, Lake Michigan, Lake Superior, and the St.
- 5 Lawrence River is a globally significant resource and ecosystem,
- 6 holding 21 percent of the world's surface freshwater; and
- 7 Whereas, The Great Lakes and St. Lawrence River provides
- 8 drinking water to more than 48 million Americans and Canadians and
- 9 supplies 56 billion gallons of water per day for municipal,
- 10 agricultural, and industrial use; and
- 11 Whereas, On September 7, 2012, by signing a revised Great

- 1 Lakes Water Ouality Agreement, the United States and Canada
- 2 reaffirmed their commitment to binational cooperation "to restore,
- 3 protect, and enhance the water quality of the Great Lakes to
- 4 promote the ecological health of the Great Lakes basin."; and
- 5 Whereas, An abundant supply of clean and affordable water is
- 6 essential to support a healthy population, a thriving economy, and
- 7 a well-functioning ecosystem; and
- 8 Whereas, As the major source of water for communities located
- 9 within the Great Lakes basin, the Great Lakes system is a vital
- 10 resource in which all the region's residents share a common
- 11 interest; and
- 12 Whereas, The Great Lakes are an economic powerhouse for the
- 13 region, supporting industries such as shipping, agriculture,
- 14 technology, manufacturing, recreation, and tourism; and
- 15 Whereas, The waters and shoreline of the Great Lakes provide
- 16 exceptional habitat for thousands of species of native mammals,
- 17 birds, amphibians, fish, and plants; and
- 18 Whereas, The Great Lakes basin is home to numerous beaches,
- 19 parks, forests, harbors, marinas, piers, lighthouses, boardwalks,
- 20 and islands that provide recreational opportunities for swimming,
- 21 hiking, surfing, boating, kayaking, canoeing, fishing, hunting,
- 22 photography, wildlife watching, and more; and
- 23 Whereas, The Great Lakes are Michigan's most valuable natural
- 24 resource and are fundamental to the state's identity and quality of
- 25 life. The Great Lakes also have extraordinary economic value for
- 26 Michigan, providing jobs for more than 800,000 Michigan residents;
- 27 a world-renown commercial and sport fishery with an annual value of
- 28 more than \$4 billion; the foundation for a \$12.8 billion travel
- 29 industry; water resources for manufacturing industries, which

- 1 produce 60 percent of our nation's steel and 60 percent of our
- 2 automobiles; a maritime transportation network; and harbors and
- 3 marinas that support a \$2 billion annual recreational boating
- 4 industry; and
- 5 Whereas, The region's environment, economy, and people rely on
- 6 the clean, healthy waters of the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence
- 7 River; now, therefore, be it
- 8 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 9 body recognize September 7, 2019, as Great Lakes-St. Lawrence
- 10 Appreciation Day; and be it further
- 11 Resolved, That we encourage all citizens to learn about the
- 12 importance of the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence River to the economy
- 13 and the environment of Michigan.
