## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.131

Rep. Neeley offered the following resolution: 1 A resolution to declare June 19, 2019, as Juneteenth 2 Independence Day in the state of Michigan. 3 Whereas, News of the end of slavery did not reach the frontier areas of the United States, in particular the state of Texas and 4 the other southwestern states, until months after the conclusion of 5 6 the Civil War. This was more than 2½ years after President Abraham 7 Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863; 8 and 9 Whereas, On June 19, 1865, Union soldiers, led by Major General Gordon Granger, arrived in Galveston, Texas, with news that 10 the Civil War had ended and that the enslaved were free; and 11 12 Whereas, African-Americans who had been slaves in the Southwest celebrated June 19, commonly known as "Juneteenth 13



- 1 Independence Day", as inspiration and encouragement for future
- 2 generations; and
- 3 Whereas, African-Americans from the Southwest have continued
- 4 the tradition of observing Juneteenth Independence Day for over 150
- 5 years; and
- 6 Whereas, Juneteenth Independence Day celebrations have been
- 7 held to honor African-American freedom while encouraging self-
- 8 development and respect for all cultures; and
- **9** Whereas, The faith and strength of character demonstrated by
- 10 former slaves and the descendants of former slaves remain an
- 11 example for all people of the United States, regardless of
- 12 background, religion, or race; and
- 13 Whereas, Slavery was not officially abolished until the
- 14 ratification of the 13<sup>th</sup> Amendment to the Constitution of the United
- 15 States in December 1865; and
- 16 Whereas, Over the course of its history, the United States has
- 17 grown into a symbol of democracy and freedom around the world; now,
- 18 therefore, be it
- 19 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 20 this legislative body declare June 19, 2019, as Juneteenth
- 21 Independence Day in the state of Michigan.
