- 1 A resolution to recognize June 2020 as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual,
- 2 Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ) Pride Month in the state of
- 3 Michigan.
- 4 Whereas, Pride began 50 years ago in 1970 with the one-year
- 5 anniversary of the Stonewall Riots. In 1969, a black trans woman
- 6 named Marsha P. Johnson, along with other LGBTQ individuals, risked

- 1 their lives to protest the over-policing of the LGBTO community and
- 2 the injustice that threatened their existence on a daily basis.
- 3 This multi-day protest became known as the Stonewall Riots and is
- 4 credited by many for starting the modern-day LGBTQ equality
- 5 movement; and
- 6 Whereas, That movement has marked by tragedy, especially the
- 7 slow and insufficient government response to assist those with
- 8 HIV/AIDS; by celebration, including the historic Obergefell Supreme
- 9 Court decision in 2015 which affirmed marriage equality nationwide;
- 10 and by struggle, notably the ongoing effort to include
- 11 discrimination protections for the LGBTQ community in state and
- 12 federal law; and
- 13 Whereas, Michigan's LGBTQ community is not protected from
- 14 discrimination in housing, employment, or public accommodation. The
- 15 decades-old push to include sexual orientation, gender identity,
- 16 and gender expression among the existing protected classes in the
- 17 Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act has never been put up for a vote in
- 18 the Legislature; and
- 19 Whereas, Everyone in Michigan benefits from the multiple
- 20 talents, viewpoints, and cultural backgrounds of all of its
- 21 residents. Expanding the Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act would
- 22 preserve the freedom, worth, and dignity of those in the LGBTQ
- 23 community from people who seek to do them harm; and
- 24 Whereas, Michigan should expend all efforts to attract and
- 25 retain talent. Amending the Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act would
- 26 signal to the nation we are welcoming to those who wish to
- 27 contribute to the economic vitality of our state; and
- 28 Whereas, The people of Michigan understand, appreciate, and
- 29 value the cultural, civic, and economic contributions of the LGBTQ

- 1 communities to the greater community of the state, and affirm a
- 2 celebration of love, living authentically, and accepting ourselves;

- 4 Whereas, June is recognized and celebrated as LGBTQ Pride
- 5 Month throughout the country and worldwide; now, therefore, be it
- 6 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 7 this legislative body recognize June 2020 as Lesbian, Gay,
- 8 Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ) Pride Month in the state
- 9 of Michigan.
