## SENATE RESOLUTION NO.42

Senator Wojno offered the following resolution: 1 A resolution recognizing May 5-11, 2019, as InfantSEE® Week. 2 Whereas, The most critical stages of vision development occur 3 in the first year of a child's life when the eye undergoes rapid 4 and profound changes; and 5 Whereas, It is recommended infants should receive a 6 comprehensive baseline eye exam between the ages of six to twelve 7 months because undetected eye and vision problems can lead to 8 permanent vision impairment or loss of life; and 9 Whereas, One-in-ten children are at-risk from undiagnosed eye and vision problems. By the time children enter school, nearly 25 10 percent will need or wear corrective lenses; and 11 12 Whereas, One-in-thirty children will be affected by amblyopia-

- 1 a leading cause of vision loss in people younger than forty-five
- 2 years; and
- 3 Whereas, Undetected vision problems can contribute to a
- 4 decrease in a child's quality of life and may lead to developmental
- 5 and behavioral difficulties which impede classroom learning, as
- 6 well as increase the costs to society; and
- 7 Whereas, Early detection of vision problems is the best way to
- 8 treat and prevent permanent vision impairment; and
- 9 Whereas, Member Optometrists of the American Optometric
- 10 Association and The Vision Care Institute® of Johnson & Johnson,
- 11 Inc. have partnered to create InfantSEE®, a public health program
- 12 to provide a one-time, no cost, eye assessment for infants six to
- 13 twelve months; and
- 14 Whereas, InfantSEE® is a program that is comprised of nearly
- 15 4,000 optometrists volunteering their services across the country.
- 16 InfantSEE® has provided over 140,000 infants with comprehensive eye
- 17 assessments since the start of the program in 2005; now therefore,

- 19 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 20 body recognize the week of May 5-11, 2019, as InfantSEE® Week; and
- 21 be it further
- 22 Resolved, We commend the members of the Michigan Optometric
- 23 Association and the profession of optometry on the eleventh
- 24 anniversary of the InfantSEE® program for voluntarily dedicating
- 25 their expertise and services to the infants of Michigan; and be it
