## SENATE RESOLUTION NO.57

Senators Runestad, Brinks, Bullock, MacDonald, Bizon, Lucido, McMorrow, Santana, Victory and Polehanki offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to commemorate June 6, 2019, as the inaugural
- 2 Indian-American Legislative Day in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, The people of Michigan are honored to represent many
- 4 cultures and are proud to join with all residents of Indian
- 5 heritage in acknowledging the contributions of Indian-Americans to
- 6 our state; and
- 7 Whereas, In 1947, India proclaimed independence and officially
- 8 became a self-governing country, marking the beginning of its
- 9 identity as a free and sovereign nation; and
- 10 Whereas, Like the United States, India is a diverse nation of

- 1 many cultures and religions, and Indian-Americans have brought to
- 2 Michigan a true melting pot of diverse Indian heritage; and
- 3 Whereas, Americans identifying as Indian-Americans in Michigan
- 4 are expected to approach a population of over 100,000 by the coming
- 5 census; and
- 6 Whereas, India has proved to be a courageous nation with a
- 7 growing democracy, seeking to establish its basic, fundamental
- 8 principles of freedom, opportunity, and justice; and
- 9 Whereas, Indian-Americans have brought to Michigan that same
- 10 courage and commitment to these shared ideals; and
- 11 Whereas, Michigan residents who hail from India, or who have
- 12 ancestral ties to India, continually demonstrate the greatness of
- 13 the culture, arts, traditions, and natural beauty of their
- 14 homeland; and
- 15 Whereas, Michigan residents who immigrated from India have
- 16 achieved high levels of education with over 40% having attained a
- 17 post graduate degree; and
- 18 Whereas, The contributions of these individuals are notable
- 19 and reflect success in many fields, including education, medicine,
- 20 science, technology, business, industry, and public policy; and
- 21 Whereas, Michigan welcomes the opportunity to promote a
- 22 greater understanding of the Indian-American culture, while also
- 23 providing an opportunity for Michiganders to recognize the
- 24 contributions of Indian-Americans to our state's economy; now
- 25 therefore, be it
- 26 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 27 body commemorate June 6, 2019, as the inaugural Indian-American
- 28 Legislative Day in the state of Michigan; and be it further
- 29 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the

- 1 Asian Pacific American Caucus to be distributed to Indian American
- 2 communities and associations.
