

**FY 2020-21 SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS**  
**Summary: House Substitute**  
**House Bill 4420 (H-1)**



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**Overview**

House Bill 4420 (H-1) contains supplemental appropriation adjustments to various state department budgets for FY 2020-21. The bill appropriates \$3.2 billion Gross. Of that, \$1.0 billion is from the state's general fund and \$2.2 billion is from federal COVID relief funding that was authorized through the federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act in an effort to support the economic recovery of individuals, families, and businesses struggling with effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Appropriation and boilerplate priorities initiated by the legislature and the State Budget Office are identified following this overview.

**FY 2020-21 Supplemental Boilerplate Items**

**GENERAL SECTIONS**

***Sec. 201. State Spending and State Appropriations Paid to Local Units of Government***

Estimates total state spending from state sources and payments to be made to local units of government.

***Sec. 202. Appropriations Subject to Management and Budget Act***

Subjects appropriations to the Management and Budget Act, 1984 PA 431.

***Sec. 203. State Administrative Board Transfers***

Authorizes the legislature, by a concurrent resolution adopted by a majority of the members elected to and serving in each house, to inter-transfer funds if the State Administrative Board transfers funds.

***Sec. 204. Appropriations Subject to Federal Audit and Reporting Requirements***

Subjects appropriations to applicable federal audit and reporting requirements; requires prompt action if instances of noncompliance are identified; requires the state budget director to notify appropriations committees and fiscal agencies of incidences of noncompliance.

***Sec. 205. Report on Status of COVID-19 Appropriations***

Requires the state budget director to report on the status of all funds appropriated related to the coronavirus relief effort on a monthly basis until all funds are exhausted.

***Sec. 206. Budget Stabilization Fund Pay-In***

Provides calculations of incoming and outgoing revenue for the Budget Stabilization Fund as required by the Management and Budget Act; appropriates \$385.0 million for deposit into the Budget Stabilization Fund for FY 2020-21. This represents an increase of \$350.0 million over the existing appropriation to the fund for FY 2020-21.

***Sec. 207. Premium Payments Tie-Bar***

Tie-bars all funding in the bill for premium payments for frontline workers to HB 4082.

**CORRECTIONS**

***Sec. 301. Does v MDOC Settlement Work Project Designation***

Designates unexpended funds as a work project appropriation; authorizes funds to carry forward and to be available for the same purpose in the following fiscal year.

**ENVIRONMENT, GREAT LAKES, AND ENERGY**

***Sec. 351. Contaminated Site Remediation***

Specifies expenditure of appropriation on remediation of non-petroleum contaminated sites (Part 201 of NREPA).

***Sec. 352. High Water Infrastructure Grants***

Requires appropriation to be used for grants to local communities for severe weather and climate planning (\$2.5 million) and infrastructure (\$37.5 million); caps individual planning grants at \$200,000 and infrastructure grants at \$2.5 million; requires 25% local match..

## **FY 2020-21 Supplemental Boilerplate Items**

### ***Sec. 353. PFAS Program***

Requires appropriation to be used for grants to municipal airports and drinking water systems for PFAS contaminant remediation or alternate water system connection costs; requires report on expenditures.

## **HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES**

### ***Sec. 401. Recovery High Schools***

Allocates \$600,000 to recovery high schools in accordance with section 273a of the Mental Health Code.

### ***Sec. 402. Recovery Community Organizations***

Allocates \$600,000 to recovery community organizations in accordance with section 273b of the Mental Health Code.

### ***Sec. 403. Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE)***

Requires the statewide PACE program enrollment cap to be increased by not less than 100.

### ***Sec. 404. Homeless Programs***

Requires appropriation to be used to increase funding for current contracted providers for homeless services provided under the emergency shelter program.

### ***Sec. 405. Nursing Facility Grants***

Requires a \$20.00 per day increase to nursing facilities that have experienced a 5% or greater decline in their average daily census when compared to their average daily census during FY 2018-19.

### ***Sec. 406. State Nursing Facility Policy Investigation Grants***

Requires appropriation to be used for the Prosecuting Attorneys Coordinating Council to create a grant program for county prosecutor's offices to investigate state nursing facility processes and policies in response to COVID-19, including the accuracy of data published by the state and compliance with FOIA; prohibits grants from exceeding \$500,000 per county prosecutor's office; requires reports; designates unexpended funding as a work project appropriation.

### ***Sec. 407. Hawthorn Center***

Requires appropriation to be used to plan and construct a new Hawthorn Center for children and adolescents; designates unexpended funding as a work project appropriation.

### ***Sec. 408. Long-Term Pediatric Psychiatric Inpatient Hospitals***

Requires appropriation to be used to create a competitive grant program to increase the number of long-term pediatric psychiatric inpatient hospitals or centers; outlines regional distribution of funding; designates unexpended funding as a work project appropriation.

### ***Sec. 409. McLaren Northern Michigan Psychiatric Beds***

Requires appropriation to be used to support 12 new psychiatric beds.

### ***Sec. 410. McLaren Greater Lansing Behavioral Health Pilot Program***

Requires appropriation to be used for a pilot program for additional behavioral health services through a partnership with state-based institutions on staffing assistance and shared services.

### ***Sec. 411. Emergency Department Behavioral Health Care***

Requires appropriation to be used to create a competitive grant program for infrastructure investments to improve behavioral health care provided through emergency departments.

### ***Sec. 412. Private Accredited Child Welfare Agency Coronavirus Relief Grants***

Requires appropriation to be allocated to child welfare agencies that are members of the Association of Accredited Child and Family Agencies for eligible COVID-19 expenses, such as personal protection equipment, facility modifications, and technology upgrades.

## **LABOR AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY**

### ***Sec. 451. Agricultural Processing Support Grants***

Requires appropriation to be used for grants to aid the recovery of Michigan's agricultural supply chain businesses; authorizes funds to be used for personal protective equipment, to provide training, and for any other goods or services that facilitate the recovery of agricultural supply chain businesses.

### ***Sec. 452. Community Health Campuses Pilot Project***

Requires appropriation to be awarded for a pilot project that develops an integrated wellness facility that includes mental, physical, and behavioral health components; requires pilot to serve underserved areas where one-stop wellness is deficient or absent; requires facility to include indoor aquatics, gymnasium, and workout facilities and the workout facilities must provide no or low-cost access to individuals earning 200% of the federal poverty level.

### ***Sec. 453. Unemployment Compensation Fund Deposit***

Requires appropriation to be deposited into the Unemployment Compensation Fund no later than May 1, 2021 for the purpose of offsetting expected exposure to state fraud and improper payment during the COVID-19 crisis; requires expenditure of federal funds prior to expenditure of general fund appropriations.

## **FY 2020-21 Supplemental Boilerplate Items**

### ***Sec. 454. Unemployment Insurance Agency Benefit Claims Monitoring***

Requires appropriation to be used to support ongoing costs related to unemployment insurance benefit claims monitoring and fraud detection through the use of a third-party service that provides a proprietary identity document capture and verification solution.

## **LEGISLATURE**

### ***Sec. 501. Independent Studies – Pupil Learning Loss***

Requires \$500,000 to be used for a study that compares pupil learning loss across virtual, hybrid, and in-person instruction in the state of Michigan.

### ***Sec. 502. Independent Studies – COVID-19 Outcomes***

Requires \$500,000 to be used for a study that examines the effect of COVID-19 stay-at-home orders, shutdowns, and other mandates on COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and deaths; requires study to include effect of policy prescriptions on magnitude and timing of cases; a comparison of outcomes and metrics in Michigan to Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, and Wisconsin, and information on the effectiveness of mask mandates in youth athletics.

## **TECHNOLOGY, MANAGEMENT, AND BUDGET**

### ***Sec. 551. Broadband Expansion of Michigan Act***

Requires appropriation to be used to support the Statewide Broadband Service Grant Program created under the Broadband Expansion Act of Michigan, 2020 PA 224.

### ***Sec. 552. State Employee Rightsizing***

Requires appropriation to be used to provide an incentive for state workers, not related to early-out retirement or severances, to leave state employment as a result of increased efficiency of the state workforce; caps the value of any rightsizing incentive at an amount equal to six weeks of pay.

### ***Sec. 553. State Facility Divestments***

Requires appropriation to support costs associated with divesting state-owned, rented, and leased properties, building, and office space, including selling, early-termination of leases and rent, and demolition; requires DTMB to provide a report with a list of expenditures and a description of each property, the benefit of each expenditure, and any additional state facilities under consideration for divestment.

### ***Sec. 554. Venture Michigan Fund II Voucher Purchase***

Authorizes the state budget director to pay outstanding obligations owed by Venture Michigan Fund at an amount of \$60.7 million to Stanton Equity Trading Delaware LLC in return for the tax voucher certificates issued by Venture Michigan Fund to Stanton Equity Trading Delaware LLC; lists the stipulations for the payment as found in Section 23 of the Michigan Early Stage Venture Investment Act (2003 PA 296); requires the state treasurer to destroy the tax vouchers upon receipt.

## **TRANSPORTATION**

### ***Sec. 601. Local Road and Bridge Building Initiative***

Requires appropriation to be used to support a statewide program for the rehabilitation or replacement of road and bridges owned by local road agencies; requires a progress report by September 30.

### ***Sec. 602. State Trunkline Fund Bond Advance Repayment***

Requires appropriation to be used to retire bonds issued by MDOT prior to January 1, 2021.

### ***Sec. 603. Transportation Bond Repayment Sinking Trust Fund***

Requires appropriation to be credited to the Transportation Bond Repayment Sinking Trust Fund established in House Bill Request Number 02538'21; tie-bars appropriation to HB 4082.

## **TREASURY**

### ***Sec. 651. Return to Work Grants***

Requires funding to be granted to individuals who leave the unemployment system and return to the workforce; caps grant amounts at \$1,000 per individual; requires the department to develop an online form for individuals to use to verify employment and removal from unemployment benefits.

### ***Sec. 652. Water and Sewer Replacement Grants***

Requires appropriation to be used for eligible water and sewer replacement projects identified in asset management plans under the Stormwater, Asset Management, and Wastewater Grant Program administered by the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy; requires Department of Treasury to develop an application process; requires report; designates funds as a work project appropriation.

## **REPEALER**

### ***Sec. 1101. Repeal Budget Stabilization Fund***

Repeals section 204 of 2020 PA 257 to replace it with section 206 of this bill.

**FY 2020-21 Supplemental Boilerplate Items**

***Sec. 1002. Repeal Recovery Grant Language***

Repeals sections 977 and 978 of Article 6 of 2020 PA 166 to replace them with sections 401 and 402 of this bill.
