NONOPIOID DIRECTIVE FORM

House Bill 5261 as introduced Sponsor: Rep. Abdullah Hammoud

Committee: Health Policy Complete to 10-27-21

SUMMARY:

House Bill 5261 would amend the Public Health Code to allow an opioid to be administered to a patient who has a nonopioid directive form in cases of medical necessity and to require the form to be prominently displayed in the patient's medical record.

A nonopioid directive allows patients to notify health professionals that they do not want to be administered opioids—often because they are most at risk of misusing opioids, including those with a history of an opioid disorder. The form was introduced by 2018 PA 554.²

However, the code allows a prescriber with a controlled substance license or a nurse acting on the order of the prescriber to administer an opioid to a patient with a nonopioid directive form if, in the prescriber's professional opinion, the administration is medically necessary.

The bill would add another exception under which an opioid could be administered: if the opioid is for intraoperative use—which means occurring or performed during the course of a surgical operation.

Additionally, the bill would provide that, in the rules regarding nonopioid directive forms, the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) would have to require that a patient's medical record clearly display whether the patient has executed a nonopioid directive form or had a form executed on his or her behalf in a manner similar to indicating whether the patient has any allergies.
