## SUMMARY:

House Bill 5664 would amend the Michigan Employment Security Act, which among other things allows the Unemployment Insurance Agency (UIA), or its duly authorized agents, to examine or copy the books, records, and papers of an employing unit that relate to any requirement pertaining to the act.

The bill would provide that the UIA or its agents could not require an employing unit to provide a book, record, or paper for examining or copying in a form other than the form in which that book, record, or paper exists at that time.

The bill also would make several editorial changes that are not substantive, such as replacing “commission” with “unemployment agency.”
