SUMMARY:

House Bill 6042 would amend the Revised School Code to allow a school board to provide *critical incident mapping data* for a school building it operates, instead of or in addition to blueprints, when submitting detailed and accurate building and site plans to the appropriate local law enforcement agency as part of its school safety procedures. Critical mapping data provided under these provisions would have to meet all of the following:

- Be compatible with software platforms used by a local, state, or federal public safety agency that provides emergency services.
- Be provided in a printable format.
- Be verified for accuracy through a walk-through of a school building and school grounds.
- Be oriented to true north.

Critical incident mapping data would mean information provided in an electronic or digital format to assist law enforcement or emergency first responders in an emergency. The information provided would have to include at least all of the following:

- Accurate floor plans overlaid on, or current aerial imagery of, a school building or school plan.
- Site-specific labeling that matches the structure of the school building, including the following:
 - Room labels.
 - Hallway names.
 - External door or stairwell numbers.
 - Locations of hazards.
 - Key utility locations.
 - Key boxes.
 - Automated external defibrillators.
 - Trauma kits.
- Site-specific labeling that matches the school grounds, including parking areas, athletic fields, surrounding roads, and neighboring properties.
- Gridded overlay with x/y coordinates.
