## **HOUSE BILL NO. 4061**

January 28, 2021, Introduced by Reps. Slagh, O'Malley, Allor, Bezotte, Damoose, Fink and Beeler and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 2016 PA 235, entitled "Public threat alert system act," by amending sections 2 and 3 (MCL 28.672 and 28.673).

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act, "public threat" means a clear,
- 2 present, persistent, ongoing, and random threat to public safety
- 3 that is likely to lead to an immediate or nearly immediate loss of
- 4 life or property. A public threat includes, but is not limited to,
- 5 an any of the following:

- 1 (a) An act of terrorism. , an
- 2 (b) An unresolved mass shooting. , or an
- 3 (c) An unresolved mass shooting spree.
- 4 (d) A natural disaster including, but not limited to, a severe storm or flood.
- 6 (e) An industrial explosion.
- 7 (f) A train derailment.

- (g) An announcement of an endangered missing individual.
- 9 Sec. 3. (1) The department of state police shall establish and 10 maintain the public threat alert system plan.
- 12 (2) The public threat alert system plan shall must be designed 12 to rapidly disseminate useful information in a predetermined manner 13 to radio and television stations within this state and to wireless 14 devices through the existing wireless emergency alert system 15 operated under federal law.
- 16 (3) The Subject to subsection (4), the public threat alert 17 system plan shall must be activated only in accordance with the 18 policies established by the department of state police.
- 19 (4) The public threat alert system plan must not be activated 20 to transmit an announcement of a new law or executive order, 21 including transmitting to wireless devices through the existing 22 wireless emergency alert system operated under federal law, unless 23 it is necessary to transmit the announcement of the new law or 24 executive order using the public threat alert system plan to 25 respond to an immediate or nearly immediate loss of life or 26 property.
