April 29, 2021, Introduced by Reps. Steenland, Hertel and Lilly and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 2014 PA 547, entitled "Industrial hemp research and development act," by amending section 2 (MCL 286.842), as amended by 2018 PA 641.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Broker" means to engage or participate in the marketing
- 3 of industrial hemp by acting as an intermediary or negotiator
- 4 between prospective buyers and sellers.
- 5 (b) "Cannabis" means the plant Cannabis sativa L. and any part

- (c) "Department" means the department of agriculture and ruraldevelopment.
- 4 (d) "Director" means the director of the department, or his or5 her designee.
- 6 (e) "GPS coordinates" means latitude and longitude coordinates7 derived from a global positioning system.
- 8 (f) "Grow" means to plant, propagate, grow, cultivate, or9 harvest live plants or viable seeds.
- (g) "Grower" means a person registered by the department underthis act to grow industrial hemp.
- (h) "Handle" means to possess, store, or transport industrial
 hemp on premises owned, operated, or controlled by a registered
 grower or licensed processor-handler.
 - (i) "Industrial hemp" means the plant Cannabis sativa L. and any part of that plant, including the viable seeds of that plant and all derivatives, extracts, cannabinoids, isomers, acids, salts, and salts of isomers, whether growing or not, with a delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol concentration of not more than 0.3% on a dry weight basis. Industrial hemp includes industrial hemp commodities and products and topical or ingestible animal and consumer products derived from the plant Cannabis sativa L. with a delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol concentration of not more than 0.3% on a dry weight basis.that term as defined in section 3 of the Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marihuana Act, 2018 IL 1, MCL 333.27953.
 - (j) "Licensing and registration fund" means the industrial hemp licensing and registration fund created in section 5.
- (k) "Location ID" means the unique identifier established bythe applicant for each unique set of GPS coordinates where

- (l) "Market" means to promote or sell industrial hemp or an
- 4 industrial hemp commodity or product. Market includes, but is not

- 7 (m) "Nonviable seed" means seed that has been crushed,
- 8 dehulled, heat treated, or otherwise rendered to have a 0.0%
- 9 germination rate.
- 10 (n) "Person" means an individual, partnership, corporation,
- 11 association, or other legal entity.
- 12 (o) "Plot" means a contiguous area in a field, greenhouse, or
- 13 indoor growing structure containing the same variety of industrial
- 14 hemp throughout the area.
- 15 (p) "Process" means to convert raw industrial hemp into a
- 16 marketable form.
- 17 (q) "Processor-handler" means a person licensed by the
- 18 department under this act to process, handle, broker, or market
- 19 industrial hemp.
- 20 (r) "Program" means the industrial hemp licensing and
- 21 registration program established by this act.
- 22 (s) "Propagule" means a plant or plant part that is utilized
- 23 to grow a new plant.
- 24 (t) "Research fund" means the industrial hemp research and
- 25 development fund created in section 4.
- 26 (u) "Testing facility" means a safety compliance facility
- 27 licensed under the medical marihuana facilities licensing act, 2016
- 28 PA 281, MCL 333.27101 to 333.27801, or a testing facility approved
- 29 by the department.

- 1 (v) "THC" means tetrahydrocannabinol.that term as defined in 2 section 3 of the Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marihuana Act, 3 2018 IL 1, MCL 333.27953.
- 4 (w) "Variety" means a subdivision of a species that has the 5 following characteristics:
- 6 (i) The subdivision is uniform, in the sense that variations
 7 between the subdivision and other subdivisions in essential and
 8 distinctive characteristics are describable.
- 9 (ii) The subdivision is distinct, in the sense that the
 10 subdivision can be differentiated by 1 or more identifiable
 11 morphological, physiological, or other characteristics from all
 12 other known subdivisions.
- (iii) The subdivision is stable, in the sense that thesubdivision will remain uniform and distinct if reproduced.
- 15 (x) "Viable seed" means seed that has a germination rate of greater than 0.0%.
- 17 (y) "Volunteer cannabis plant" means a cannabis plant that is
 18 not intentionally planted and grows of its own accord from seeds or
 19 roots in the years following an intentionally planted cannabis
 20 crop.
