## SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4953

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code," (MCL 380.1 to 380.1852) by adding section 1293.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1293. (1) By not later than August 1, 2023, and by not
- later than August 1 each year thereafter, the department shall 2
- 3 develop or update and shall make available to all school districts,
- intermediate school districts, public school academies, and 4
- nonpublic schools informational packets to be given by school 5
- 6 officials to each pupil or student enrolled in any of grades 8 to
- 7 12 in the school district, intermediate school district, public
- school academy, or nonpublic school. An informational packet 8
- 9 described in this subsection may consist of a collection of links

- 1 to web-based exploratory programs or written material shared in
- 2 electronic form and must include, but is not limited to, all of the
- 3 following:
- 4 (a) Information, disaggregated by prosperity region, regarding
- 5 the location of school districts, intermediate school districts,
- 6 and public school academies that choose to offer early/middle
- 7 college programs, advanced placement (AP) programs, and college-
- 8 level examination programs (CLEP) that are available under state or
- 9 federal law to pupils enrolled in any of grades 8 to 12.
- 10 (b) Information regarding the average tuition and average fees
- 11 associated with attendance at each public university and community
- 12 college in this state.
- 13 (c) The 6-year success rate for each public university and
- 14 community college in this state.
- 15 (d) Information regarding the dollar value for student loans
- 16 disbursed, the number of unique student loans, and the number of
- 17 unique recipients who received student loans incurred by
- 18 individuals attending a postsecondary institution in this state.
- 19 (e) A list of at least 10 postsecondary vocational training
- 20 opportunities for individuals who have been awarded a high school
- 21 diploma or who have been granted a high school equivalency
- 22 certificate, as that term is defined in section 4 of the state
- 23 school aid act of 1979, MCL 388.1604. The list described in this
- 24 subdivision must include, but is not limited to, the average costs
- 25 associated with certification through the listed vocational
- 26 training opportunities.
- 27 (f) A list of at least 20 of the most in-demand occupations in
- 28 this state, as determined by the department. The list under this
- 29 subdivision must include, but is not limited to, a breakdown of the

- 1 average salary for each occupation and the required educational
- 2 level for each occupation.
- 3 (g) A list of public and private resources designed to aid
- 4 pupils and the parents and legal guardians of pupils in navigating
- 5 postsecondary education. The list under this subdivision must
- 6 include, but is not limited to, information concerning public and
- 7 private scholarship opportunities available to pupils.
- 8 (h) A list of public-service opportunities for high school
- 9 graduates. The list under this subdivision must include, but is not
- 10 limited to, information concerning opportunities available for high
- 11 school graduates in the public-safety sector, including, but not
- 12 limited to, opportunities in the Armed Forces of the United States,
- 13 police departments, and fire departments. As used in this
- 14 subdivision, "Armed Forces of the United States" means the United
- 15 States Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, Space Force, or Coast
- 16 Guard or other military force designated by Congress as a part of
- 17 the Armed Forces of the United States, including the reserve
- 18 components.
- 19 (i) Information regarding any postsecondary training and
- 20 tuition assistance available to those who choose a career in public
- 21 service.
- 22 (2) By not later than August 1, 2023, and by not later than
- 23 August 1 each year thereafter, the department shall post the
- 24 informational packet made available to school districts,
- 25 intermediate school districts, public school academies, and
- 26 nonpublic schools under subsection (1) on its website homepage.
- 27 (3) By not later than October 1, 2023, and by not later than
- 28 October 1 each year thereafter, the board of a school district or
- 29 intermediate school district, board of directors of a public school

- 1 academy, or governing body of a nonpublic school shall ensure that
- 2 the superintendent or chief administrator, as applicable, of each
- 3 school operated by the board, board of directors, or governing body
- 4 provides, in electronic form or nonelectronic form, the
- 5 informational packet made available to the school district,
- 6 intermediate school district, public school academy, or nonpublic
- 7 school under subsection (1) to each pupil enrolled in any of grades
- 8 8 to 12 in the school district, intermediate school district,
- 9 public school academy, or nonpublic school.
- 10 (4) Each other department or agency of this state shall assist
- 11 the department in compiling any information that is necessary for
- 12 the implementation of this section.
