## **HOUSE BILL NO. 5569**

November 30, 2021, Introduced by Rep. Brann and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1846 RS 14, entitled "Of county officers,"

by amending section 77 (MCL 51.77), as amended by 1982 PA 313.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 77. (1) Before a county may obtain obtains its grant from
- 2 the amount annually appropriated for secondary road patrol and
- 3 traffic accident prevention to implement section 76, the county
- 4 shall enter into an agreement for the secondary road patrol and
- 5 traffic accident prevention services with the office of criminal
- 6 justice. highway safety planning. A county applying for a grant for

- **8** (3) The sheriff's department of a county is required to
- 9 provide the expanded services described in section 76 only to the
- 10 extent that state funds are provided.
- 11 (4) For the fiscal years beginning October 1, 1980, and
- 12 October 1, 1981, a county's share of the amount annually
- 13 appropriated for secondary road patrol and traffic accident
- 14 prevention shall must be the same percentage that the county

- 6 (6) The annual report required under subsection (1) shall must7 include the following:
- 8 (a) A description of the services provided by the sheriff's
- **9** department of the county under section 76, other than the services
- 10 provided in a county park.
- 11 (b) A description of the services provided by the sheriff's
- 12 department of the county under section 76 in county parks in the
- 13 county.
- 14 (c) A copy of each resolution by a city or village of the
- 15 county which requests the sheriff's department of the county to
- 16 provide the services described in section 76.
- 17 (d) A copy of each contract between a county and a township of
- 18 the county in which township the sheriff's department is providing
- 19 a law enforcement service.
- 20 (e) The recommendations of the sheriff's department of the
- 21 county on methods of improving the services provided under section
- 22 76; improving the training programs of law enforcement officers;
- 23 and improving the communications system of the sheriff's
- 24 department.
- 25 (f) The total number of sworn officers in the sheriff's
- 26 department.
- 27 (g) The number of sworn officers in the sheriff's department
- 28 assigned to road safety programs.
- 29 (h) The accident and fatality data for incorporated and

- unincorporated areas of the county during the preceding calendar
  vear.
- 3 (i) The crime statistics for the incorporated and4 unincorporated areas of the county during the preceding calendar5 year.
- 6 (j) The law enforcement plan developed under subsection (7).
- 7 (k) A description of the role alcohol played in the incidences8 of personal injury traffic accidents and traffic fatalities in the9 county.
- 10 (l) Other information required by the department of **technology**, 11 management, and budget.

- (7) The sheriff of each county —and the director of the department of state police, and the director of the office of criminal justice—or their authorized representatives shall meet and develop a law enforcement plan for the unincorporated areas of the county. The law enforcement plan shall must be reviewed and updated periodically.
- 21 (a) A copy of each initial report filed before April 1 of that 22 year and a copy of each annual report filed before April 1 of that 23 year under subsection (6).
  - (b) The recommendations of the office of criminal justice
    highway safety planning on methods of improving the coordination of
    the law enforcement agencies of this state and the counties,
    cities, villages, and townships of this state; improving the
    training programs for law enforcement officers; and improving the
    communications systems of those agencies.

- (c) A description of the role alcohol played in the incidences
   of personal injury traffic accidents and traffic fatalities in this
   state.
- 4 (9) From the 1% allocated to the office of criminal justice 5 highway safety planning for administration, planning, and 6 reporting, the office of criminal justice highway safety planning 7 shall conduct an impact and cost effectiveness study which that 8 will review state, county, and local road patrol and traffic 9 accident prevention efforts. This study shall must be conducted in 10 cooperation with the Michigan sheriffs' association, Sheriffs' Association and the Michigan association Association of chiefs 11 12 Chiefs of police, Police, and the department of state police. Annual reports on results of the study shall must be submitted to 13

the senate and house appropriations committees by April 1 of each
