## PART 2

## PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

**GENERAL SECTIONS**

23 Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state  
24 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state sources under  
25 part 1 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022 is \$42,538,700  
26 and total state spending from state sources to be paid to local  
27 units of government is \$40,038,700.00.

28 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized  
29 under this part and part 1 and the departments, commissions,

1 boards, offices, and programs for which appropriations are made  
2 under this part and part 1 are subject to the management and budget  
3 act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

4 Sec. 203. If the state administrative board, acting under  
5 section 3 of 1921 PA 2, MCL 17.3, transfers funds from an amount  
6 appropriated under part 1, the legislature may, by a concurrent  
7 resolution adopted by a majority of the members elected to and  
8 serving in each house, inter-transfer funds within part 1 for the  
9 particular department, board, commission, office, or institution.

11 **DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES**

12 Sec. 301. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for health  
13 homes, the department of health and human services shall maintain  
14 the number of behavioral health homes in PIHP regions 1, 2, and 8  
15 and maintain the number of substance use disorder health homes in  
16 PIHP regions 1, 2, 4, and 9. The department may expand the number  
17 of behavioral health homes in PIHP regions 6 and 7 and the number  
18 of substance use disorder health homes in PIHP regions 6, 7, and  
19 10.

20 (2) On a quarterly basis, the department of health and human  
21 services shall provide a report to the house and senate  
22 appropriation subcommittees on the department budget, the house and  
23 senate fiscal agencies, the house and senate policy offices, and  
24 the state budget office on the number of individuals being served  
25 and expenditures incurred by each PIHP region by site.

26 Sec. 302. (1) The funds appropriated in part 1 for Medicaid  
27 mental health services shall be used to complete the phase out of  
28 local funds provided by each PIHP, from internal resources, used as  
29 a part of the state match required under the Medicaid program in

1 order to increase capitation rates for PIHPs.

2 (2) The funds appropriated in part 1 for Medicaid mental  
3 health services must not be spent or otherwise distributed unless  
4 all of the following bills of the 101st Legislature are enacted  
5 into law:

6 (a) Senate Bill No. 597.

7 (b) Senate Bill No. 598.

8 Sec. 303. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
9 adverse childhood experiences awareness program, the department of  
10 health and human services shall appropriate \$3,500,000.00 to the  
11 Michigan ACE Initiative in partial support of House Concurrent  
12 Resolution No. 2 of the 100th Legislature and Senate Concurrent  
13 Resolution No. 8 of the 100th Legislature. The funds are to be used  
14 to support the continued implementation of an awareness program on  
15 adverse childhood experiences, particularly for instructional and  
16 administrative staff in Michigan's schools, and to begin a program  
17 to focus resilience efforts to mitigate the effects of adverse  
18 childhood experiences.

19 (2) Prior to the release of funds, the Michigan ACE Initiative  
20 shall provide a strategic plan to the department of health and  
21 human services that identifies how the funds will be used over a  
22 12-month period. The strategic plan must include all of the  
23 following components:

24 (a) The targeted school districts and amounts that will be  
25 used to provide the awareness efforts to instructional, service,  
26 and administrative staff along with the intended collaborating  
27 partners.

28 (b) The focus and amounts to be used for any demonstration  
29 projects and the intended collaborating partners.

1 (c) The amount to be targeted to establish a center for  
2 adverse childhood experiences and resilience and the names of  
3 collaborating partners.

4 (d) The amount to be targeted to Michigan's Child Abuse  
5 Councils to assist in work on adverse childhood experiences  
6 awareness and prevention.

7 (3) Within 30 days of the receipt of the strategic plan  
8 required in subsection (2), the department of health and human  
9 services shall submit the strategic plan to the senate and house  
10 appropriations subcommittees on the department budget, the senate  
11 and house fiscal agencies, and the state budget office.

12 (4) Funds appropriated for adverse childhood experiences  
13 awareness program shall be considered work project funds and shall  
14 not lapse at the close of the fiscal year and shall be available  
15 for expenditures for projects under this section until the projects  
16 have been completed. The following is in compliance with section  
17 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL  
18 18.1451a:

19 (a) The purpose of the work project is to support the Michigan  
20 ACE Initiative.

21 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to the  
22 Michigan ACE Initiative.

23 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
24 \$3,500,000.00.

25 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

26 Sec. 304. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
27 behavioral health provider recruitment, the department of health  
28 and human services shall make 1-time payments to health care  
29 providers of up to \$250,000.00 to cover the costs of hiring new

1 positions in the behavioral health field.

2 (2) Funds appropriated for behavioral health provider  
3 recruitment shall be considered work project funds and shall not  
4 lapse at the close of the fiscal year and shall be available for  
5 expenditures for projects under this section until the projects  
6 have been completed. The following is in compliance with section  
7 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL  
8 18.1451a:

9 (a) The purpose of the work project is to provide funding for  
10 grants to reimburse hiring costs for health care providers for new  
11 behavioral health provider staff.

12 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to health care  
13 providers.

14 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
15 \$15,000,000.00.

16 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

17 Sec. 305. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for child  
18 and adolescent psychiatric emergency department, the department of  
19 health and human services shall allocate \$6,000,000.00 to a  
20 hospital to expand its adolescent and children's emergency  
21 psychiatry unit through the creation of a dedicated emergency room  
22 for children and adolescents. In order to be eligible to receive  
23 funding, the hospital must be associated with a 4-year medical  
24 school located in a city with a population between 110,000 and  
25 114,000, according to the 2010 federal decennial census.

26 (2) Funds appropriated for child and adolescent psychiatric  
27 emergency department shall be considered work project funds and  
28 shall not lapse at the close of the fiscal year and shall be  
29 available for expenditures for projects under this section until

1 the projects have been completed. The following is in compliance  
2 with section 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
3 MCL 18.1451a:

4 (a) The purpose of the work project is to create a dedicated  
5 child and adolescent psychiatric emergency department.

6 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to a hospital  
7 associated with a medical school.

8 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
9 \$6,000,000.00.

10 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

11 Sec. 306. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
12 clinical integration fund, the department of health and human  
13 services shall issue grants to facilities and providers that wish  
14 to clinically integrate their setting with physical and behavioral  
15 health services and providers.

16 (2) Funds appropriated for clinical integration fund shall be  
17 considered work project funds and shall not lapse at the close of  
18 the fiscal year and shall be available for expenditures for  
19 projects under this section until the projects have been completed.  
20 The following is in compliance with section 451a(1) of the  
21 management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

22 (a) The purpose of the work project is to provide funding for  
23 grants to help cover costs to facilities and providers that wish to  
24 clinically integrate their setting with physical and behavioral  
25 health services and providers.

26 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to health care  
27 providers and facilities.

28 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
29 \$25,000,000.00.

1 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

2 (3) The funds appropriated in part 1 for clinical integration  
3 fund must not be spent or otherwise distributed unless all of the  
4 following bills of the 101st Legislature are enacted into law:

5 (a) Senate Bill No. 597.

6 (b) Senate Bill No. 598.

7 Sec. 307. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
8 community-based care project, the department of health and human  
9 services shall appropriate \$750,000.00 to a nonprofit organization  
10 organized under the laws of this state that is exempt from federal  
11 income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the internal revenue code of  
12 1986, 26 USC 501, located in a city with a population between  
13 97,000 and 109,000 according to the 2010 federal decennial census  
14 to implement a community-based care project to support the entire  
15 family while they are in contact with the child welfare system. To  
16 be eligible for the funding, the entity must have been established  
17 in 1978 and have a stated mission of: with the support of the  
18 community, we preserve families when possible and create new  
19 families when necessary.

20 (2) Funds appropriated for community-based care project shall  
21 be considered work project funds and shall not lapse at the close  
22 of the fiscal year and shall be available for expenditures for  
23 projects under this section until the projects have been completed.  
24 The following is in compliance with section 451a(1) of the  
25 management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

26 (a) The purpose of the work project is to establish a  
27 community-based care project for child welfare.

28 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to a nonprofit  
29 that works with abused and neglected children.

1 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
2 \$750,000.00.

3 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.  
4 Sec. 308. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
5 community mental health services programs integration readiness,  
6 the department of health and human services shall provide 1-time  
7 funding to support community mental health services programs'  
8 efforts to make system, information technology, staffing, and  
9 administrative improvements for integration readiness.

10 (2) Funds appropriated for community mental health services  
11 programs integration readiness shall be considered work project  
12 funds and shall not lapse at the close of the fiscal year and shall  
13 be available for expenditures for projects under this section until  
14 the projects have been completed. The following is in compliance  
15 with section 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
16 MCL 18.1451a:

17 (a) The purpose of the work project is to provide funding to  
18 community mental health services programs to make improvements for  
19 integration readiness.

20 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants provided to  
21 community mental health services programs.

22 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
23 \$50,000,000.00.

24 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

25 (3) The funds appropriated in part 1 for community mental  
26 health services programs integration readiness must not be spent or  
27 otherwise distributed unless all of the following bills of the  
28 101st Legislature are enacted into law:

29 (a) Senate Bill No. 597.

1 (b) Senate Bill No. 598.

2 Sec. 309. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
3 community substance use disorder prevention, education, and  
4 treatment grants, the department of health and human services shall  
5 provide funding, pursuant to federal laws, rules, and regulations,  
6 including awards to private entities that have contracts to provide  
7 community-based substance use disorder services.

8 (2) Funds appropriated for community substance use disorder  
9 prevention, education, and treatment grants shall be considered  
10 work project funds and shall not lapse at the close of the fiscal  
11 year and shall be available for expenditures for projects under  
12 this section until the projects have been completed. The following  
13 is in compliance with section 451a(1) of the management and budget  
14 act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

15 (a) The purpose of the work project is to provide funding to  
16 private entities that have contracts to provide community-based  
17 substance use disorder services.

18 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to eligible  
19 providers.

20 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
21 \$10,000,000.00.

22 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

23 Sec. 310. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for crisis  
24 stabilization units, the department of health and human services  
25 shall create a 1-time grant pool for entities interested in  
26 establishing crisis stabilization units as described in chapter 9A  
27 of the mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1971 to 330.1979.  
28 Any qualified provider in this state shall be eligible to apply for  
29 a portion of the funding.

1 (2) Funds appropriated for crisis stabilization units shall be  
2 considered work project funds and shall not lapse at the close of  
3 the fiscal year and shall be available for expenditures for  
4 projects under this section until the projects have been completed.  
5 The following is in compliance with section 451a(1) of the  
6 management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

7 (a) The purpose of the work project is to provide funding to  
8 establish crisis stabilization units.

9 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to eligible  
10 providers.

11 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
12 \$25,000,000.00.

13 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

14 (3) As used in this section, "crisis stabilization unit" means  
15 that term as defined in section 100a of the mental health code,  
16 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1100a.

17 Sec. 311. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
18 department of health and human services integration readiness, the  
19 department of health and human services shall make 1-time  
20 investments to support implementation of Senate Bill No. 597 of the  
21 101st Legislature and Senate Bill No. 598 of the 101st Legislature.  
22 The funding appropriated in part 1 shall be used to harness  
23 external support for study and plan development, project  
24 management, information technology system enhancements, and  
25 administrative investments.

26 (2) Funds appropriated for department of health and human  
27 services integration readiness shall be considered work project  
28 funds and shall not lapse at the close of the fiscal year and shall  
29 be available for expenditures for projects under this section until

1 the projects have been completed. The following is in compliance  
2 with section 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
3 MCL 18.1451a:

4 (a) The purpose of the work project is to provide funding to  
5 the department of health and human services to make improvements  
6 for integration readiness.

7 (b) The projects will be accomplished by utilizing state  
8 employees or contracts with service providers, or both.

9 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
10 \$10,000,000.00.

11 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

12 (3) The funds appropriated in part 1 for department of health  
13 and human services integration readiness must not be spent or  
14 otherwise distributed unless all of the following bills of the  
15 101st Legislature are enacted into law:

16 (a) Senate Bill No. 597.

17 (b) Senate Bill No. 598.

18 Sec. 312. The funds appropriated in part 1 for Hawthorn Center  
19 expansion shall be used to support capital improvements to expand  
20 capacity at the Hawthorn Center. This funding shall be used to  
21 increase both staffing and bed capacity.

22 Sec. 313. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
23 hospital infrastructure enhancements, funding shall be used to  
24 create a 1-time grant pool. Hospitals shall be allowed to apply for  
25 grants from the fund to be used to invest in infrastructure  
26 necessary to improve care for behavioral health patients who enter  
27 through the hospital's emergency department. Grants may be used for  
28 initiatives such as providing emergency department entrances and  
29 emergency department rooms for behavioral health patients that are

1 separate from the emergency department entrances and emergency  
2 department rooms for the general patient population.

3 (2) Funds appropriated for the hospital infrastructure  
4 enhancements shall be considered work project funds and shall not  
5 lapse at the close of the fiscal year and shall be available for  
6 expenditures for projects under this section until the projects  
7 have been completed. The following is in compliance with section  
8 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL  
9 18.1451a:

10 (a) The purpose of the work project is to provide funding for  
11 grants to hospitals to invest in infrastructure necessary to  
12 improve care for behavioral health patients who enter through the  
13 hospital's emergency department.

14 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to hospitals.

15 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
16 \$20,000,000.00.

17 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

18 Sec. 314. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
19 infrastructure grants to enhance pediatric inpatient services,  
20 funding shall be used to create a competitive grant program for  
21 health care providers to increase the number of slots in long-term  
22 pediatric psychiatric inpatient hospitals, centers, or psychiatric  
23 residential treatment facilities by a total of at least 120 slots  
24 statewide. Grant applicants must identify 20% matching funds as  
25 part of the grant application. A single facility shall not receive  
26 more than \$25,000,000.00 of the funding appropriated in part 1, and  
27 the grants must be made to different geographic regions of this  
28 state.

29 (2) The department of health and human services shall

1 determine and publish the evidence-based treatment care and  
2 services program for the population to be served by the slots  
3 described in subsection (1) not later than 6 months after the  
4 effective date of this act.

5 (3) Funds appropriated for infrastructure grants to enhance  
6 pediatric inpatient services shall be considered work project funds  
7 and shall not lapse at the close of the fiscal year and shall be  
8 available for expenditures for projects under this section until  
9 the projects have been completed. The following is in compliance  
10 with section 451a(1) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
11 MCL 18.1451a:

12 (a) The purpose of the work project is to implement a  
13 competitive grant funding program for health care providers to  
14 increase the number of long-term pediatric psychiatric inpatient  
15 slots online across this state.

16 (b) The projects will be accomplished by grants to health care  
17 facilities.

18 (c) The total estimated cost of the work project is  
19 \$100,000,000.00.

20 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

21 (4) As used in this section, "health care provider" means an  
22 entity that is licensed under part 215 of the public health code,  
23 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.21501 to 333.21571, or section 137 of the  
24 mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1137.

25 Sec. 315. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
26 integrated care center, the department of health and human services  
27 shall allocate \$15,000,000.00 to a PIHP operating in a county with  
28 a population greater than 1,300,000, according to the 2010 federal  
29 decennial census, to implement a centrally located integrated

1 service center to offer separate child and adult units to provide

14 Sec. 334. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for public  
15 television investment, the department of health and human services  
16 shall provide \$1,500,000.00 in funding to a public television  
17 station located in a city with a population greater than 500,000  
18 according to the most recent federal decennial census.

19 (2) The funding allocated in subsection (1) shall be used to  
20 offer programming, engagement opportunities, and links to resources

8 Sec. 335. From the funds appropriated in part 1 for behavioral  
9 health bed capacity, \$35,000,000.00 shall be awarded to a nonprofit  
10 Michigan health system exempt from federal income tax under section  
11 501(c)(3) of the internal revenue code of 1986, 26 USC 501, that is  
12 located within a city with a population of 28,000 to 29,000 and in  
13 a county with a population between 1,000,000 and 1,500,000,  
14 according to the most recent federal decennial census, for the  
15 purpose of expanding mental health services. The Michigan health  
16 system receiving funds under this section must have at least 4  
17 acute care facilities in a county with a population between

20 Sec. 336. (1) From the appropriation in part 1 for medication  
21 for opioid use disorder demonstration program, the department shall  
22 allocate \$1,400,000.00 for the development of a demonstration

24 impact of medication for opioid use disorder (MOUD) on patient  
25 health outcomes and reduce health care costs to this state. The  
26 department shall develop a request for proposal for a demonstration  
27 program to be operated jointly by all of the following  
28 organizations:

29 (a) A Michigan public university with previous experience in

1 pharmacogenomics related to opioid use disorder that is a recipient

15 Sec. 401. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for career  
16 path apprenticeship program, the department of labor and economic

18 program.

19 (2) The funding allocated pursuant to subsection (1) shall be

7 Sec. 402. From the funds appropriated in part 1 for Michigan  
8 enhancement grants, \$1,000,000.00 shall be allocated to a nonprofit  
9 Michigan health care system organized under the laws of this state  
10 that is exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of  
11 the internal revenue code of 1986, 26 USC 501, and that is located  
12 in a county with a population between 280,800 and 281,000 and in a  
13 city with a population greater than 105,000 according to the 2010  
14 federal decennial census for the purpose of supporting a behavioral  
15 health pilot project. The purpose of the project is a redesign of  
16 the campus to accommodate creating a behavioral health facility.

18 **DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE**

19 Sec. 501. (1) Funds appropriated in part 1 for jail mental  
20 health pilot project must be used by the department of state police  
21 as a 50% match for the costs of developing and constructing a  
22 central intake assessment facility in a county with a population  
23 between 800,000 and 850,000 according to the 2010 federal decennial  
24 census.

25 (2) The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for jail  
26 mental health pilot project are designated as a work project  
27 appropriation. Unencumbered or unallotted funds shall not lapse at  
28 the end of the fiscal year and shall be available for expenditures  
29 under this section until the project has been completed. The

1 following is in compliance with section 451a of the management and

3 (a) The purpose of the project is to pay 50% of the costs to

8 employees, contracts with vendors, or local partners.

9 (c) The estimated cost of the project is \$25,000,000.00.
