SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 1061

A bill to amend 2000 PA 489, entitled "Michigan trust fund act,"

(MCL 12.251 to 12.262) by adding section 3a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 3a. (1) The local government reimbursement fund is created in the state treasury.
- 3 (2) The state treasurer shall deposit money and assets
- 4 received under section 21(7) of the use tax act, 1937 PA 94, MCL
- 5 205.111, or from any other source in the fund. The state treasurer
- 6 shall direct the investment of money in the fund and credit
- 7 interest and earnings from the investments to the fund.
- 8 (3) Money in the fund at the close of the fiscal year remains
- 9 in the fund and does not lapse to the general fund.

- 1 (4) The department is the administrator of the fund for audits 2 of the fund.
- 3 (5) The department shall expend money from the fund, upon
- 4 appropriation, only for the purpose of compensating municipalities
- 5 as described in this subsection. Subject to subsection (6), on or
- 6 before May 31, 2024, and on or before May 31 of each year
- 7 thereafter, the department shall compensate municipalities for the
- 8 revenue lost during the immediately preceding property tax year as
- 9 a result of exemptions claimed under section 9o(2)(b) of the
- 10 general property tax act, 1893 PA 206, MCL 211.90, as determined by
- 11 the department.
- 12 (6) If the money in the fund is insufficient to fully
- 13 compensate all municipalities that lost revenue as described in
- 14 subsection (5), payments from the fund must be prorated amongst
- 15 those municipalities.
- 16 (7) As used in this section:
- 17 (a) "Fund" means the local government reimbursement fund
- 18 created in subsection (1).
- 19 (b) "Municipality" means that term as defined in section 5 of
- 20 the local community stabilization authority act, 2014 PA 86, MCL
- 21 123.1345.
- 22 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
