- (3) A licensee, or the clerk, servant, agent, or employee of a
 licensee, shall not be in an intoxicated condition on the licensed
 premises.
- 4 (4) A licensee shall not allow an intoxicated person to 5 frequent or loiter on the licensed premises except where the intoxicated person has been refused service of further alcoholic 6 liquor and continues to remain on the premises for the purpose of 7 8 eating food, seeking medical attention, arranging transportation 9 that does not involve driving himself or herself, or any other 10 circumstances where requiring the person to vacate the premises 11 immediately would be considered dangerous to that person or to the 12 public.
- 13 (5) A licensee shall not allow a minor to consume alcoholic
 14 liquor or to possess alcoholic liquor for personal consumption on
 15 the licensed premises.
- 16 (6) A licensee shall not allow any person an individual less
 17 than 18-17 years of age to sell or serve alcoholic liquor.
- 18 (7) A licensee shall not allow any person an individual less
 19 than 18 years of age to work or entertain on a paid or voluntary
