HOUSE BILL NO. 4238

February 11, 2021, Introduced by Rep. LaFave and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1965 PA 213, entitled

"An act to provide for setting aside the conviction in certain criminal cases; to provide for the effect of such action; to provide for the retention of certain nonpublic records and their use; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain public agencies and officers; and to prescribe penalties,"

by amending section 1c (MCL 780.621c), as added by 2020 PA 187.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1c. (1) A person shall not apply to have set aside, and a
- 2 judge shall not set aside, a conviction for any of the following:

- 1 (a) A felony for which the maximum punishment is life
- 2 imprisonment or an attempt to commit a felony for which the maximum
- 3 punishment is life imprisonment.
- 4 (b) A violation or attempted violation of section 136b(3),
- 5 136d(1)(b) or (c), 145c, 145d, 520c, 520d, or 520g of the Michigan
- 6 penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.136b, 750.136d, 750.145c,
- 750.145d, 750.520c, 750.520d, and 750.520g.
- 8 (c) A violation or attempted violation of section 520e of the
- 9 Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.520e, if the conviction
- 10 occurred on or after January 12, 2015.
- 11 (d) The following traffic offenses:
- 12 (i) A Subject to subsection (3), a conviction for operating
- 13 while intoxicated committed by any person.
- (ii) Any traffic offense committed by an individual with an
- 15 indorsement on his or her operator's or chauffeur's license to
- 16 operate a commercial motor vehicle that was committed while the
- 17 individual was operating the commercial motor vehicle or was in
- 18 another manner a commercial motor vehicle violation.
- 19 (iii) Any traffic offense that causes injury or death.
- 20 (e) A felony conviction for domestic violence, if the person
- 21 has a previous misdemeanor conviction for domestic violence.
- 22 (f) A violation of former section 462i or 462j or chapter
- 23 LXVIIA or chapter LXXXIII-A of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA
- 24 328, MCL 750.462a to 750.462h and 750.543a to 750.543z.
- 25 (2) The prohibition on the setting aside of the convictions
- 26 under subsection (1) upon application also applies to the setting
- 27 aside of convictions without application under section 1g.
- 28 (3) The prohibition on setting aside a conviction for
- 29 operating while intoxicated under subsection (1) (d) (i) does not

- 1 apply to a conviction for a first violation operating while
- 2 intoxicated offense if the person applying to have the first

- 1 a violation listed in subparagraph (i).
- 2 (b) "Operating while intoxicated" means a violation of any of
- 3 the following that is not a first violation operating while
- 4 intoxicated offense:
- 5 (i) Section 625 or 625m of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA
- 6 300, MCL 257.625 and 257.625m.
- 7 (\ddot{u}) A local ordinance substantially corresponding to a
- 8 violation listed in subparagraph (i).
- 9 (iii) A law of an Indian tribe substantially corresponding to a
- 10 violation listed in subparagraph (i).
- 11 (iv) A law of another state substantially corresponding to a
- 12 violation listed in subparagraph (i).
- 13 (v) A law of the United States substantially corresponding to
- 14 a violation listed in subparagraph (i).
