HOUSE BILL NO. 4286

February 23, 2021, Introduced by Rep. Meerman and referred to the Committee on Local Government and Municipal Finance.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 267, entitled "Open meetings act,"

by amending section 3a (MCL 15.263a), as amended by 2020 PA 254.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3a. (1) A meeting of a public body held, in whole or in
- 2 part, electronically by telephonic or video conferencing in
- 3 compliance with this section and, except as otherwise required in
- 4 this section, all of the provisions of this act applicable to a
- 5 nonelectronic meeting, is permitted by this act in the following

- 1 circumstances:
- 2 (a) Before March 31, 2021 and retroactive to March 18, 2020,
- 3 any circumstances, including, but not limited to, any of the
- 4 circumstances requiring accommodation of absent members described
- 5 in section 3(2).
- 6 (b) On Subject to subdivision (d), on and after March 31, 2021
- 7 through December 31, 2021, only those circumstances requiring
- 8 accommodation of members absent for the reasons described in
- 9 section 3(2). For the purpose of permitting an electronic meeting
- 10 due to a local state of emergency or state of disaster, this
- 11 subdivision applies only as follows:
- (i) To permit the electronic attendance of a member of the
- 13 public body who resides in the affected area.
- (ii) To permit the electronic meeting of a public body that
- 15 usually holds its meetings in the affected area.
- 16 (c) After Subject to subdivision (d), after December 31, 2021,
- 17 only in the circumstances requiring accommodation of members absent
- 18 due to military duty as described in section 3(2).
- 19 (d) On and after March 31, 2021, for a public body whose
- 20 members are appointed or elected in a manner other than a general
- 21 or special election and who are not compensated for their service
- 22 beyond normal costs incurred to compensate travel to and from
- 23 meeting locations, any circumstances, including, but not limited
- 24 to, any of the circumstances requiring accommodation of absent
- 25 members described in section 3(2).
- 26 (2) A meeting of a public body held electronically under this
- 27 section must be conducted in a manner that permits 2-way
- 28 communication so that members of the public body can hear and be
- 29 heard by other members of the public body, and so that public

- 1 participants can hear members of the public body and can be heard
- 2 by members of the public body and other participants during a
- 3 public comment period. A public body may use technology to
- 4 facilitate typed public comments during the meeting submitted by
- 5 members of the public participating in the meeting that may be read
- 6 to or shared with members of the public body and other participants
- 7 to satisfy the requirement under this subsection that members of
- 8 the public be heard by others during the electronic meeting and the
- 9 requirement under section 3(5) that members of the public be
- 10 permitted to address the electronic meeting.
- 11 (3) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (8), a physical
- 12 place is not required for an electronic meeting held under this
- 13 section, and members of a public body and members of the public
- 14 participating electronically in a meeting held under this section
- 15 that occurs in a physical place are to be considered present and in
- 16 attendance at the meeting for all purposes.
- 17 (4) If a public body directly or indirectly maintains an
- 18 official internet presence that includes monthly or more frequent
- 19 updates of public meeting agendas or minutes, the public body
- 20 shall, in addition to any other notices that may be required under
- 21 this act, post advance notice of a meeting held electronically
- 22 under this section on a portion of the public body's website that
- 23 is fully accessible to the public. The public notice on the website
- 24 must be included on either the homepage or on a separate webpage
- 25 dedicated to public notices for nonregularly scheduled or
- 26 electronic public meetings that is accessible through a prominent
- 27 and conspicuous link on the website's homepage that clearly
- 28 describes its purpose for public notification of nonregularly
- 29 scheduled or electronic public meetings. Subject to the

- 1 requirements of this section, any scheduled meeting of a public
- 2 body may be held as an electronic meeting under this section if a
- 3 notice consistent with this section is posted at least 18 hours
- 4 before the meeting begins. Notice of a meeting of a public body
- 5 held electronically must clearly explain all of the following:
- **6** (a) Why the public body is meeting electronically.
- 7 (b) How members of the public may participate in the meeting
- 8 electronically. If a telephone number, internet address, or both
- 9 are needed to participate, that information must be provided
- 10 specifically.
- 11 (c) How members of the public may contact members of the
- 12 public body to provide input or ask questions on any business that
- 13 will come before the public body at the meeting.
- 14 (d) How persons with disabilities may participate in the
- 15 meeting.
- 16 (5) Beginning on the effective date of the amendatory act that
- 17 added this section, if an agenda exists for an electronic meeting
- 18 held under this section by a public body that directly or
- 19 indirectly maintains an official internet presence that includes
- 20 monthly or more frequent updates of public meeting agendas or
- 21 minutes, the public body shall, on a portion of the website that is
- 22 fully accessible to the public, make the agenda available to the
- 23 public at least 2 hours before the electronic meeting begins. This
- 24 publication of the agenda does not prohibit subsequent amendment of
- 25 the agenda at the meeting.
- 26 (6) A public body shall not, as a condition of participating
- 27 in an electronic meeting of the public body held under this
- 28 section, require a person to register or otherwise provide his or
- 29 her name or other information or otherwise to fulfill a condition

precedent to attendance, other than mechanisms established and
required by the public body necessary to permit the person to
participate in a public comment period of the meeting.

- (7) Members of the general public otherwise participating in a meeting of a public body held electronically under this section are to be excluded from participation in a closed session of the public body held electronically during that meeting if the closed session is convened and held in compliance with the requirements of this act applicable to a closed session.
- 10 (8) At a meeting held under this section that accommodates
 11 members absent due to military duty or a medical condition, only
 12 those members absent due to military duty or a medical condition
 13 may participate remotely. Any member who is not on military duty or
 14 does not have a medical condition must be physically present at the
 15 meeting to participate.
