## **HOUSE BILL NO. 4332**

February 24, 2021, Introduced by Reps. Steven Johnson and Allor and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 81116 (MCL 324.81116), as amended by 2017 PA 199.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 81116. (1) The owner of an ORV requiring licensure under
- 2 this part shall file an application for a license with the
- 3 department or a dealer on forms provided by the department. If an
- 4 ORV is sold by a dealer, the application for a license shall be

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- 1 submitted to the department by the dealer in the name of the owner.
- 2 The application shall include a certification. The owner of the
- 3 vehicle shall sign the application or, if the application is filed
- 4 electronically, provide information requested by the department to
- 5 verify the owner's identity. The application shall be accompanied
- 6 by a fee as provided in subsection (2). A person shall not file an
- 7 application for a license that contains false information. Upon
- 8 receipt of the application in approved form and <del>upon payment of the</del>
- 9 appropriate fee, the department or dealer shall issue to the
- 10 applicant a license. A license shall be issued and is valid for the
- 11 12-month period beginning April 1 and ending the following March
- **12** 31. each year.

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- (2) The fee for a license is as follows:
- 14 (a) Except as provided in subdivision (c), if the license does
- 15 not authorize operation of the ORV on state ORV trails, \$26.25.
- 16 (b) Except as provided in subdivision (c), if the license
- 17 authorizes operation of the ORV on state ORV trails, \$36.25.
- 18 (c) For a license valid for a 12-month period beginning April
- 19 1, 2024 or a subsequent April 1, no fee.
- 20 (3) Dealers A dealer may purchase from the department ORV
- 21 licenses for resale to owners of vehicles requiring licensure under
- 22 this part. The department shall refund to dealers a dealer the
- 23 purchase price of any ORV licenses returned within 90 days after
- 24 the end of the 12-month period for which they were valid. A dealer
- 25 shall maintain and provide to the department records of ORV license
- 26 sales on forms provided by the department. In addition to the sale
- 27 of ORV licenses, a dealer engaged in the sale, lease, or rental of
- 28 ORVs as a regular business may sell any other license or permit
- 29 authorized by the department to be sold by other dealers under the

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- 1 statutes of this state.
- 2 (4) Before a vehicle requiring an ORV license is operated, the
- 3 owner shall ensure that a license is permanently attached to the
- 4 vehicle in the manner prescribed by and, subject to this
- 5 subsection, in the location designated by the department. The
- 6 license for a 2-wheel vehicle shall be attached as provided in
- 7 either of the following:
- 8 (a) Centered on the exposed surface of the rear fender.
- 9 (b) Located at a visible place on a front suspension fork.
- 10 (5) If, at the time of sale when a vehicle otherwise requiring
- 11 a license under this part is sold, the purchaser certifies on a
- 12 form provided by the department that the <del>purchased vehicle</del>
- 13 otherwise requiring a license under this part vehicle will be used
- 14 and stored outside of this state and will not be returned by the
- 15 purchaser to this state for use, then a license is not required for
- 16 the vehicle.
- 17 (6) If a license acquired by the owner of an ORV is lost or
- 18 destroyed, the department shall provide that person with a
- 19 replacement license free of charge. The department may require a
- 20 person requesting a replacement license to supply sufficient
- 21 evidence of the loss or destruction of the original license.
