HOUSE BILL NO. 4517

March 16, 2021, Introduced by Reps. Rabhi, Lilly and Hauck and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 2018 IL 1, entitled "Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marihuana Act," by amending section 3 (MCL 333.27953), as amended by 2020 PA 208.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Cultivate" means to propagate, breed, grow, harvest, dry,
- 3 cure, or separate parts of the marihuana plant by manual or
- 4 mechanical means.
- 5 (b) "Department" means the department of licensing and

- 2 (c) "Industrial hemp" means a plant of the genus Cannabis and
- 3 any part of that plant, whether growing or not, with a delta-9
- 4 tetrahydrocannabinol concentration of 0.3% or less on a dry-weight
- 5 basis, or per volume or weight of marihuana-infused product, or for
- 6 which the combined percent of delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol and
- 7 tetrahydrocannabinolic acid in any part of the plant, regardless of
- 8 moisture content, is 0.3% or less. Industrial hemp includes
- 9 industrial hemp-infused products.
- 10 (d) "Industrial hemp-infused product" means a topical
- 11 formulation, tincture, beverage, edible substance, or similar
- 12 product containing industrial hemp and other ingredients and that
- 13 is intended for human consumption. The delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol
- 14 concentration of an industrial hemp-infused product must be
- 15 measured based on the volume or weight of the industrial hemp-
- 16 infused product.
- (e) (d) "Licensee" means a person holding a state license.
- (f) (e) "Marihuana" means all parts of the plant of the genus
- 19 Cannabis, growing or not; the seeds of the plant; the resin
- 20 extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound,
- 21 manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the plant
- 22 or its seeds or resin, including marihuana concentrate and
- 23 marihuana-infused products. Marihuana does not include any of the
- 24 following:
- 25 (i) The mature stalks of the plant, fiber produced from the
- 26 mature stalks, oil or cake made from the seeds of the plant, or any
- 27 other compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or
- 28 preparation of the mature stalks.
- 29 (ii) Industrial hemp.

- (iii) Any other ingredient combined with marihuana to prepare
 topical or oral administrations, food, drink, or other products.
- 3 (g) (f) "Marihuana accessories" means any equipment, product,
- 4 material, or combination of equipment, products, or materials, that
- 5 is specifically designed for use in planting, propagating,
- 6 cultivating, growing, harvesting, manufacturing, compounding,
- 7 converting, producing, processing, preparing, testing, analyzing,
- 8 packaging, repackaging, storing, containing, ingesting, inhaling,
- 9 or otherwise introducing marihuana into the human body.
- 10 (h) (g) "Marihuana concentrate" means the resin extracted from
- 11 any part of the plant of the genus Cannabis.
- 12 (i) (h) "Marihuana establishment" means a marihuana grower,
- 13 marihuana safety compliance facility, marihuana processor,
- 14 marihuana microbusiness, marihuana retailer, marihuana secure
- 15 transporter, or any other type of marihuana-related business
- 16 licensed by the marijuana regulatory agency.
- (j) (i) "Marihuana grower" means a person licensed to
- 18 cultivate marihuana and sell or otherwise transfer marihuana to
- 19 marihuana establishments.
- 20 (k) (j) "Marihuana-infused product" means a topical
- 21 formulation, tincture, beverage, edible substance, or similar
- 22 product containing marihuana and other ingredients and that is
- 23 intended for human consumption.
- (1) (k)—"Marihuana microbusiness" means a person licensed to
- 25 cultivate not more than 150 marihuana plants; process and package
- 26 marihuana; and sell or otherwise transfer marihuana to individuals
- 27 who are 21 years of age or older or to a marihuana safety
- 28 compliance facility, but not to other marihuana establishments.
- 29 (m) $\frac{(l)}{l}$ "Marihuana processor" means a person licensed to obtain

- 1 marihuana from marihuana establishments; process and package
- 2 marihuana; and sell or otherwise transfer marihuana to marihuana
- 3 establishments.
- 4 (n) (m) "Marihuana retailer" means a person licensed to obtain
- 5 marihuana from marihuana establishments and to sell or otherwise
- 6 transfer marihuana to marihuana establishments and to individuals
- 7 who are 21 years of age or older.
- 8 (o) (n) "Marihuana secure transporter" means a person licensed
- 9 to obtain marihuana from marihuana establishments in order to
- 10 transport marihuana to marihuana establishments.
- 11 (p) (o)—"Marihuana safety compliance facility" means a person
- 12 licensed to test marihuana, including certification for potency and
- 13 the presence of contaminants.
- 14 (q) (p) "Marijuana regulatory agency" means the marijuana
- 15 regulatory agency created under Executive Reorganization Order No.
- **16** 2019-2, MCL 333.27001.
- (r) (q) "Municipal license" means a license issued by a
- 18 municipality pursuant to section 16 that allows a person to operate
- 19 a marihuana establishment in that municipality.
- 20 (s) (r) "Municipality" means a city, village, or township.
- 21 (t) (s) "Person" means an individual, corporation, limited
- 22 liability company, partnership of any type, trust, or other legal
- 23 entity.
- 24 (u) (t) "Process" or "processing" means to separate or
- 25 otherwise prepare parts of the marihuana plant and to compound,
- 26 blend, extract, infuse, or otherwise make or prepare marihuana
- 27 concentrate or marihuana-infused products.
- 28 (v) (u) "State license" means a license issued by the
- 29 marijuana regulatory agency that allows a person to operate a

- 2 (w) $\frac{(v)}{(v)}$ "Unreasonably impracticable" means that the measures
- 3 necessary to comply with the rules or ordinances adopted pursuant
- 4 to this act subject licensees to unreasonable risk or require such
- 5 a high investment of money, time, or any other resource or asset
- 6 that a reasonably prudent businessperson would not operate the
- 7 marihuana establishment.

- 9 unless Senate Bill No. ____ or House Bill No. 4516 (request no.
- 10 02247'21) of the 101st Legislature is enacted into law.
