HOUSE BILL NO. 4535

March 18, 2021, Introduced by Reps. Borton, Lightner, Bezotte, Paquette, Damoose, Roth, Bollin, Huizenga, Outman, O'Malley and Sabo and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 82101 and 82110 (MCL 324.82101 and 324.82110), section 82101 as amended by 2020 PA 385 and section 82110 as amended by 2004 PA 587, and by adding section 82163.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 82101. As used in this part:
- 2 (a) "Alcoholic liquor" means that term as defined in section
- 3 1d of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1d.

- 1 (b) "Auction" means the sale or offer for sale by bidding of2 real or personal property at a public or private location.
- 3 (c) "Auctioneer" means a person that is engaged in the
 4 business of conducting auctions or that offers to conduct an
 5 auction for compensation.
- 6 (d) "Conviction" means a final conviction, the payment of a
 7 fine, a plea of guilty or nolo contendere if accepted by the court,
 8 or a finding of guilt or probate court disposition on a violation
 9 of this part, regardless of whether the penalty is rebated or
 10 suspended.
- 11 (e) "Dealer" means any person engaged in the sale, lease, or
 12 rental of snowmobiles as a regular business, other than an
 13 auctioneer.
- 14 (f) "Former section 15a" means section 15a of former 1968 PA 15 74, as constituted before May 1, 1994.
- 16 (g) "Highly restricted personal information" means an
 17 individual's photograph or image, Social Security number, digitized
 18 signature, and medical and disability information.
- (h) "Highway or street" means the entire width between the
 boundary lines of every way publicly maintained if any part of it
 is open to public use for vehicular travel.
- 22 (i) "Historic snowmobile" means a snowmobile that is over 25
 23 years old and that is owned solely as a collector's item and for
 24 occasional use and for participation in club activities,
 25 exhibitions, tours, parades, and similar uses, including mechanical
 26 testing.
- 27 (j) "In-kind contributions" means services and goods as
 28 approved by the department that are provided by a grant recipient
 29 toward completion of a department-approved local snowmobile program

- 2 (k) "Law of another state" means a law or ordinance enacted by
- 3 any of the following:
- 4 (i) Another state.
- 5 (ii) A local unit of government in another state.
- 6 (iii) Canada or a province or territory of Canada.
- 7 (iv) A local unit of government in a province or territory of
- 8 Canada.
- $oldsymbol{9}$ (\$l\$) "Operate" means to ride in or on and be in actual physical
- 10 control of the operation of a snowmobile.
- 11 (m) "Operator" means any individual who operates a snowmobile.
- (n) "Owner" means any of the following:
- 13 (i) A person that holds the legal title to a snowmobile.
- 14 (ii) A vendee or lessee of a snowmobile that is the subject of
- 15 an agreement for conditional sale or lease with the right of
- 16 purchase upon performance of the conditions stated in the agreement
- 17 and with an immediate right of possession vested in the conditional
- 18 vendee or lessee.
- (iii) A person renting a snowmobile or having the exclusive use
- 20 of a snowmobile for more than 30 days.
- 21 (o) "Peace officer" means any of the following:
- (i) A sheriff.
- 23 (ii) A sheriff's deputy.
- 24 (iii) A deputy who is authorized by a sheriff to enforce this
- 25 part and who has satisfactorily completed at least 40 hours of law
- 26 enforcement training, including training specific to this part.
- 27 (iv) A village or township marshal.
- 28 (v) An officer of the police department of any municipality.

- $\mathbf{1}$ (vi) An officer of the Michigan state police.
- $\mathbf{2}$ (vii) The director and conservation officers employed by the department.
- 4 (viii) A law enforcement officer who is licensed or certified
 5 under the Michigan commission on law enforcement standards act,
- 6 1965 PA 203, MCL 28.601 to 28.615, and is policing within his or
- 7 her jurisdiction.
- **8** (p) "Personal information" means information that identifies
- 9 an individual, including an individual's driver identification
- 10 number, name, address not including zip code, and telephone number,
- 11 but does not include information on snowmobile operation or
- 12 equipment-related violations or civil infractions, operator or
- 13 snowmobile registration status, accidents, or other behaviorally-
- 14 related information.
- 15 (q) "Prior conviction" means a conviction for any of the
- 16 following, whether under a law of this state, a local ordinance
- 17 substantially corresponding to a law of this state, a law of the
- 18 United States substantially corresponding to a law of this state,
- 19 or a law of another state substantially corresponding to a law of
- 20 this state:
- 21 (i) A violation or an attempted violation of section 82127(1),
- 22 (3), (4), (5), (6), or (7), except that only 1 violation or
- 23 attempted violation of section 82127(6), a local ordinance
- 24 substantially corresponding to section 82127(6), or a law of
- 25 another state substantially corresponding to section 82127(6), or a
- 26 law of the United States substantially corresponding to section
- 27 82127(6) may be used as a prior conviction other than for
- 28 enhancement purposes as provided in section 82129a(1)(b).
- 29 (ii) Negligent homicide, manslaughter, or murder resulting from

- the operation of a snowmobile or an attempt to commit any of those
 crimes.
- (iii) Former section 15a(1), (3), (4), or (5) of 1968 PA 74.
- (iv) Former section 15a.
- 5 (r) "Probate court or family division disposition" means the 6 entry of a probate court order of disposition or family division 7 order of disposition for a child found to be within the provisions 8 of chapter XIIA of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL
- 9 712A.1 to 712A.32.
- (s) "Prosecuting attorney", unless the context requires
 otherwise, means the attorney general, the prosecuting attorney of
 a county, or the attorney representing a local unit of government.
- 16 (u) "Right-of-way" means that portion of a highway or street17 not including the roadway and any shoulder.
- 18 (v) "Roadway" means that portion of a highway or street
 19 improved, designated, or ordinarily used for vehicular travel. If a
 20 highway or street includes 2 or more separate roadways, the term
 21 roadway refers to any roadway separately, but not to all of the
 22 roadways collectively.
- (w) "Shoulder" means that portion of a highway or street on
 either side of the roadway that is normally snowplowed for the
 safety and convenience of vehicular traffic.
- 26 (x) "Snowmobile", subject to subdivision (y), means any motor27 driven vehicle that is not a vehicle that must designed for travel
 28 primarily on snow or ice and that utilizes sled-type runners or
 29 skis, an endless belt tread, or any combination of these or other

- 1 similar means of contact with the surface upon which it is operated
- 3 (i) Is engine-driven.

- 4 (ii) Has an endless belt tread.
- 5 (iii) Was originally manufactured solely for operation over 6 snow.
- 7 (*iv*) Is steered by 2 sled-type runners or skis that are in 8 contact with the snow and the distance between the centers of the 9 spindles of which is, except for a historic snowmobile, not more than 48 inches.
 - (y) Snowmobile does not include any of the following:
- 12 (i) An ORV required to be licensed under section 81115.
- 13 (ii) A vehicle required to be registered under the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923.
- 15 (z) (y) "Snowmobile account" means the snowmobile account of
 16 the Michigan conservation and recreation legacy fund provided for
 17 in section 2025.
- (aa) (z)—"Snowmobile registration fee subaccount" means the
 snowmobile registration fee subaccount of the snowmobile account
 created in section 82111.
- 21 (bb) (aa)—"Specialty court program" means a program under any
 22 of the following:
- (i) A drug treatment court, as defined in section 1060 of the
 revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.1060, in which
 the participant is an adult.
- 26 (ii) A DWI/sobriety court, as defined in section 1084 of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.1084.
- 28 (iii) A hybrid of the programs under subparagraphs (i) and (ii).
- (iv) A mental health court as defined in section 1090 of the

revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.1090. 1

2 (v) A veterans treatment court, as defined in section 1200 of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.1200. 3

(cc) (bb) "Zone 1" means all of the Upper Peninsula.

4 (dd) (cc) "Zone 2" means all of that part of the Lower 5 Peninsula north of a line beginning at and drawn from a point on 6 7 the Michigan-Wisconsin boundary line due west of the westerly 8 terminus of River Road in Muskegon County; thence due east to the 9 westerly terminus of River Road; thence north and east along the 10 center line of the River Road to its intersection with highway M-120; thence northeasterly and easterly along the center line of 11 12 highway M-120 to the junction of highway M-20; thence easterly along the center line of M-20 to its junction with US-10 at the 13 14 Midland-Bay County line; thence easterly along the center line of 15 the "business route" of highway US-10 to the intersection of 16 Garfield Road in Bay County; thence north along the center line of 17 Garfield Road to the intersection of the Pinconning Road; thence 18 east along the center line of Pinconning Road to the intersection 19 of the Seven Mile Road; thence north along the center of the Seven 20 Mile Road to the Bay-Arenac County line; thence north along the 21 center line of the Lincoln School Road (county road 25) in Arenac 22 County to the intersection of highway M-61; thence east along the 23 center line of highway M-61 to the junction of highway US-23; thence northerly and easterly along the center line of highway US-24 25 23 to the center line of the Au Gres River; thence southerly along 26 the center line of the river to its junction with Saginaw Bay of Lake Huron; thence north 78° east to the international boundary 27 line between the United States and the Dominion of Canada. 28

- 27 established under section 72114 and is designated for snowmobile
- 28 use.
- 29 (b) The trail is snow covered, and the snow is groomed for

- 2 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply under any of the following 3 circumstances:
- 4 (a) If the motor vehicle is being used for emergency or law 5 enforcement purposes.
 - (b) If the portion of the snowmobile trail on which the motor vehicle is operated is a crossing with a highway or street or a trail where operation of the motor vehicle is otherwise authorized.
 - (c) If and to the extent that the department waives the prohibition for department-sponsored events or other circumstances as determined by the director or the director's designee.
 - (3) A person who violates subsection (1) is responsible for a state civil infraction and may be ordered to pay a civil fine of not more than \$200.00. A fine collected under this section shall be deposited in the recreational snowmobile trail improvement subaccount created in section 82110.
- 17 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
