HOUSE BILL NO. 4960

June 03, 2021, Introduced by Reps. Fink, Peterson, Damoose, Beeler and Hall and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending sections 252d and 252e (MCL 257.252d and 257.252e), section 252d as amended by 2012 PA 498 and section 252e as amended by 2008 PA 539.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 252d. (1) A police agency or a governmental agency
- 2 designated by the police agency may provide for the immediate
- 3 removal of a vehicle from public or private property to a place of

- 1 safekeeping at the expense of the last-titled last titled owner of
 2 the vehicle in any of the following circumstances:
- (a) If the vehicle is in such a condition that the continued
 operation of the vehicle upon the highway would constitute an
 immediate hazard to the public.
- 6 (b) If the vehicle is parked or standing upon the highway in
 7 such a manner as to create an immediate public hazard or an
 8 obstruction of traffic.
- 9 (c) If a vehicle is parked in a posted tow away zone.
- (d) If there is reasonable cause to believe that the vehicleor any part of the vehicle is stolen.
- (e) If the vehicle must be seized to preserve evidence of a
 crime, or if there is reasonable cause to believe that the vehicle
 was used in the commission of a crime.
- (f) If removal is necessary in the interest of public safety because of fire, flood, storm, snow, natural or man-made disaster, or other emergency.
- (g) If the vehicle is hampering the use of private property by the owner or person in charge of that property or is parked in a manner that impedes the movement of another vehicle.
- (h) If the vehicle is stopped, standing, or parked in a space
 designated as parking for persons with disabilities and is not
 permitted by law to be stopped, standing, or parked in a space
 designated as parking for persons with disabilities.
- (i) If the vehicle is located in a clearly identified accessaisle or access lane immediately adjacent to a space designated asparking for persons with disabilities.
- (j) If the vehicle is interfering with the use of a ramp or acurb-cut by persons with disabilities.

- 1 (k) If the vehicle has been involved in a traffic crash and2 cannot be safely operated from the scene of the crash.
- 3 (2) Unless the vehicle is ordered to be towed by a police agency or a governmental agency designated by a police agency under 4 5 subsection (1)(a), (d), (e), or (k), if the owner or other person 6 who-that is legally entitled to possess a vehicle to be towed or 7 removed arrives at the location where the vehicle is located before 8 the actual towing or removal of the vehicle, the vehicle shall must 9 be disconnected from the tow truck, and the owner or other person 10 who that is legally entitled to possess the vehicle may take 11 possession of the vehicle and remove it without interference upon the payment of the reasonable service fee, for which a receipt 12
- 14 (3) A police agency that authorizes the removal of a vehicle
 15 under subsection (1) shall do all of the following:

shall must be provided.

- 16 (a) Check to determine if the vehicle has been reported stolen
 17 prior to before authorizing the removal of the vehicle.
 - (b) Except for vehicles impounded under subsection (1)(d),

 (e), or (k), a—the police agency shall enter the vehicle into the
 law enforcement information network as abandoned not less than an

 impounded vehicle not less than 24 hours after ordering the impound

 of the vehicle. If the vehicle has not been redeemed by the owner

 within 7 days after authorizing—the removal—impound, the police

 agency ordering the impound shall deem the vehicle abandoned, and

 within 24 hours enter the vehicle into the law enforcement

 information network as abandoned, and follow the procedures set

 forth in section 252a.
- (4) A vehicle impounded under subsection (1) (d), (e), or (k)must first be released by the police agency that authorized the

- 1 removal prior to the towing agency or custodian releasing the
 2 vehicle to the vehicle owner.
- 3 (5) Not less than 20 days but not more than 30 days after a
- 4 vehicle has been released under subsection (4), the towing agency
- 5 or custodian shall notify the police agency to enter the vehicle as
- 6 abandoned and the police agency shall enter the vehicle into the
- 7 law enforcement information network as abandoned within 24 hours of
- 8 receiving notice and follow the procedures set forth in section
- 9 252a if the impounded vehicle has not been redeemed.
- 10 Sec. 252e. (1) The following courts have jurisdiction to
- 11 determine if a police agency, towing agency or custodian, or
- 12 private property owner has acted properly in reporting or
- 13 processing a vehicle under section 252a, 252b(6) to (11), or 252d:
- 14 (a) The district court.
- 15 (b) A municipal court.
- 16 (2) The court specified in the notice prescribed in section
- 17 252a(5)(b) or 252b(7) or as provided in section 252d(3)(b) shall be
- 18 is the court that has territorial jurisdiction at the location from
- 19 where the vehicle was removed, impounded, or considered abandoned.
- 20 Venue in the district court shall be is governed by section 8312 of
- 21 the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.8312.
- 22 (3) If the owner fails to pay the accrued towing and storage
- 23 fees, the towing and storage bond posted with the court to secure
- 24 release of the vehicle under section 252a, 252b, or 252d shall must
- 25 be used to pay the towing and storage fees.
- 26 (4) The remedies under sections 252 through to 254 are the
- 27 exclusive remedies for the disposition of abandoned vehicles.
- 28 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 29 after the date it is enacted into law.
