## **HOUSE BILL NO. 5171**

June 29, 2021, Introduced by Rep. Wozniak and referred to the Committee on Insurance.

A bill to amend 1956 PA 218, entitled "The insurance code of 1956,"

by amending section 3151 (MCL 500.3151), as amended by 2019 PA 22.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3151. (1) If the mental or physical condition of a person
- 2 is material to a claim that has been or may be made for past or
- 3 future personal protection insurance benefits, at the request of an
- 4 insurer and on a showing of good cause to a court, the person shall
- 5 submit to mental or physical examination by physicians. A personal

- 1 protection insurer may include reasonable provisions that are in
- 2 accord with this section in a personal protection insurance policy
- 3 for mental and physical examination of persons claiming personal
- 4 protection insurance benefits.
- 5 (2) A physician who conducts a mental or physical examination6 under this section must be licensed as a physician in this state or
- 7 another state and meet the following criteria, as applicable:
- 8 (a) If care is being provided to the person to be examined by
- 9 a specialist, the examining physician must specialize in the same
- 10 specialty as the physician providing the care, and if the physician
- 11 providing the care is board certified in the specialty, the
- 12 examining physician must be board certified in that specialty.
- 13 (b) During the year immediately preceding the examination, the
- 14 examining physician must have devoted a majority of his or her
- 15 professional time to either or both of the following:
- 16 (i) The active clinical practice of medicine and, if
- 17 subdivision (a) applies, the active clinical practice relevant to
- 18 the specialty.
- 19 (ii) The instruction of students in an accredited medical
- 20 school or in an accredited residency or clinical research program
- 21 for physicians and, if subdivision (a) applies, the instruction of
- 22 students is in the specialty.
- 23 (3) The insurer that requests or physician who conducts an
- 24 examination under this section shall provide a statement of how the
- 25 physician meets the requirements of subsection (2) to the person
- 26 examined.
- 27 (4) A physician who conducts an examination under this section
- 28 shall provide to the person examined or the person's attorney a
- 29 list of all other cases in which, during the previous 4 years, the

- 1 physician has testified as an expert at trial or by deposition and
- 2 statements of the compensation the physician received in connection
- 3 with those cases, and the compensation to be paid the physician for
- 4 the examination and any testimony.
- 5 (5) A physician who conducts an examination under this
- 6 section, or any entity through which the physician offers his or
- 7 her services, shall not charge more than the following percentage
- 8 of the average amount that the physician charged, or entity charged
- 9 for the physician, for an equivalent examination on January 1,
- 10 2019:
- 11 (a) For an examination conducted before July 2, 2020, 55%.
- 12 (b) For an examination conducted after July 1, 2020 and before
- 13 July 2, 2021, 54%.
- 14 (c) For an examination conducted after July 1, 2021 and before
- 15 July 2, 2022, 52.5%.
- 16 (6) A person being examined under this section may elect
- 17 either or both of the following:
- 18 (a) That the examination be recorded by either audio or audio-
- 19 visual means.
- 20 (b) That the person have an attorney or other individual
- 21 present at the examination.
